



### Senior Pastor's Report Rev. Dr. Charles Myricks, Jr.





God is good and active in the work and life of the Arlington Church of God. All praise to His Holy and Matchless Name. By God's grace, ACOG remained faithful to our **mission**, stayed true to our **budget**, and is positioned for dynamic **growth** in 2023.

Arlington is blessed to have an exceptional staff, outstanding operations, and committed members who seek to be pleasing to God in all we do. The love of Jesus compels us, and our mission is unchanged: "To win the lost, mature the saved, and serve the world, to the glory of God." Our motto is, "Every member growing, serving and being cared for, by the body, for the community, to the glory of God."

Through the dedication of many, ACOG produced **in-person and online worship services** every Sunday of 2022. I strived to preach biblically and expositorily - preaching and teaching through the **Gospel of John**, and then beginning a journey through the **Gospel of Luke**. We were blessed by guest preachers, including our lay ministers, as well as by messages on **Mother's Day** and **Father's Day**, shared by non-ordained individuals in our congregation. And we captured the season of Advent in a 5-week series of messages highlighting: **Peace**, **Hope**, **Life**, **Love**, **and Light**.

ACOG's congregational life is organized into Ministry Pathways. These ministries and services offer opportunities for each person to be served and to serve others. The Flock Care Ministries, which I shepherd, and which aim to minister to congregants at the individual level, touched hundreds of lives in 2022. The Diaconate Board, Visitation, Bereavement, Wellness, Scholarship, Graduation, Baby Dedication, Wedding, and Prayer Ministries oversaw the ordinances of baptism and communion, visited the sick and shut-in, assisted with funerals, offered workshops and grief counseling, helped students afford college, helped families celebrate new life or marriage, and undergirded all ministries and concerns with prayer. We launched our Card Ministry, which lovingly sends an encouraging word to congregants in various situations. We also inaugurated an annual Love and Light Memorial Service to minister, during the Christmas season, to those who are experiencing grief from the loss of a loved one. All these ministries were rendered with a spirit of love and excellence.

In 2022, Arlington explored new ways to reach and impact people we might not otherwise access. These efforts included our month-long Financial Literacy Workshop in May that reached over 300 individuals across the country! Our Celebrate Recovery Ministry began to network and re-envision its scope resulting in considerable growth. ACOG helped take a stand against injustice by participating in the NAACP March for Justice for Jayland Walker. And we demonstrated our care for, solidarity with, and commitment to our zip code 44306 by partnering with LOVE Akron in the 306 Initiative to support children and foster care families and by participating in the East Akron Labor Day Parade. And ACOG extended Christ-like warmth and hospitality the evening we hosted the Grammy Award winning Apollo's Fire Baroque Ensemble as a community concert.

We held our first **New Year's Whiteout** - calling attention to the new life believers have in Jesus; our **Annual Church Picnic** at Bottler Park; and concluded the year with a special Watch Night video broadcast of **The Final 60 Minutes of 2022** - written and produced by Arlington members.

Throughout the year, the Holy Spirit guided ACOG in building community, vision for ministry, and spiritual growth in the youngest to the oldest.

We continue to grow our ministries to children and youth within our congregation and the surrounding neighborhood. Vacation Bible School began with a free indoor carnival that was extended to the entire neighborhood, and many neighborhood children attended the week of classes and fun. We hosted the Akron Symphony Orchestra in 2 special Children's Concerts to which we invited ACA, IJPIC, Head Start and Robinson Elementary School children and staff. We sought to build a sense of community among our youngest congregants through a Children and Youth Movie Night. And in December, we took a delegation of Arlington youth to the National Inspirational Youth Convention in Atlanta, GA.

Arlington is committed to **missions locally and abroad**. We hosted the **Kuyasa Children's Choir** from orphanages across South Africa, giving over \$5000 to support the work of **Horizon International**. In addition, we continue to directly support our missionaries **Steve and Peggy Beverly** who serve in Sri Lanka. We also raised a special offering of \$6300 for our churches doing ministry in **Ukraine**. We continue to generously support our international, national, state and local ministries of the **Church of God**.

The generosity of our congregation enables us to underwrite and support **Arlington Christian Academy** and **Irma Jones Preschool and Infant Center**. We provide both with residency and services at no charge. The combined value of our support of these ministries is in excess of \$300,000.00 annually.

We intentionally seek to develop new leaders for the Church. We held quarterly meetings with the 42 servant-leaders who lead our **Pathways Ministries** and concluded with a joint planning/implementation retreat that established the Church operating calendar for 2023. We also sponsored a delegation of assistant pastors and lay-ministers to a **Narrative Preaching Conference** in Orlando, Florida.

We are grateful for the outstanding **financial support** of Arlington and for our **finance team** who provide us with tremendous operational leadership and accountability.

Thank you for the privilege of serving this wonderful congregation. To God be the glory! Keep going team!

Arlington Christian Academy has continued to thrive and provide a superior education for each student. The curriculum consists of integrated Bible, Language Arts, Science, Social Studies, Health and Math lessons. This year our students also participated in Physical Education, Art, and Technology classes. It has been our goal to give Arlington

Christian Academy students rich experiences by helping integrate grade-level content skills with Christ-like values.

Our staff is dedicated to creating a safe and productive learning community. This process begins with a blending of creativity, innovation, and rigor to produce high academic expectations while providing experiences that will continue to foster a love for learning. It is our daily objective to work with every student to positively impact achievement and improve his or her ability to think critically.

Our motto continues to be "Uniting the Love of Learning with the Love of God." Last year we transitioned leadership of the Academy. Principal Lawrence A. Swoope retired after a stellar tenure and Principal Renee Benson Ludle was installed as Interim Principal. This year Principal Benson-Ludle was installed as the permanent Principal. In September, we started our school year with an enrollment of 87 students. This enrollment has proved quite manageable for our class sizes while focusing on improving our school climate and meeting the needs of each student both academically and behaviorally.

Our building participates in the Ohio Department of Education EdChoice Scholarship Program, of which 100% of our students participate. This scholarship program is the base of our income. Our current staff consists of 12 teachers and 7 support staff. As a team, we are dedicated to making ACA the best learning environment for all students, to the glory of God. Arlington Christian Academy is working to improve our income base through fundraising such as the Fall Golf Outing, First Friday Dress Down, Firebird Marketplace, business contributions and others. Our major fundraiser took place in the month of October 2022. We will continue to host a back-to-school Golf Outing Annually. This year we have intentionally implemented our Family Series with a number of events that promote the building of the family. Those events include; Father-Daughter Dinner Date, Mother-Daughter Spa Day, Father-Son Field Day, and the Mother-Son Cookoff.

### Our goals for the 2022-2023 school year are:

- Increase enrollment
- Support and reinforce a culture of collaboration throughout the building
- Continue to improve team atmosphere while building staff morale
- Increase school-wide fundraising efforts
- Improve academic competence.

- The 2022 school year presented staffing challenges. We lost 2 teachers for various reasons and hired one new teacher to join our family. She has been a part of our family for 8 months. It has been a pleasure working with and learning beside her.
- IJPIC qualified for a stabilization grant through the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services (ODJFS). Stabilization funds support states in providing financial relief to childcare programs by helping to defray unexpected business costs associated with the pandemic and to help stabilize childcare program operations.
- Three classrooms were closed due to COVID exposure once in January, July, and August. The COVID policy required that we close the classrooms for two to three days. All exposure cases occurred near a weekend or holiday, which minimized family schedule disruption.
- ❖ IJPIC had a graduation ceremony for **14 graduates**. We had at least 75 guests come to celebrate them. It was a sweet celebration.
- This year, we decided to have in-house activities during the summer instead of traveling to various places. Our activities included the West African Drummer, Kona, an ice truck, the Balloon Lady, Akron Zoo, Build-a-Bear Workshop, and many more. All activities were at no cost to the parents.
- Congratulations to our four staff members who received their Child Development Associate (CDA) credential.
- Above all things we thank God for keeping us open and blessing us. Many centers closed due to the impact of COVID. We thank God for all that he has done for IJPIC.
