ADDRESSING PHYSICIAN BURNOUT

Please join us for this important community conversation with Dr. Lotte Dyrbye, who will be explaining the prevalence of burnout and potential contributors, describing the consequences of burnout, and identifying individual and organizational strategies to enhance healthcare professional well-being.



Lotte Dyrbye, MD, MHPE is the Senior Associate Dean of Faculty and Chief Well-Being Officer at the University of Colorado School of Medicine. Dr. Dyrbye oversees faculty affairs, faculty and leadership development programs, and diversity, equity, and inclusion efforts. She also leads initiatives aimed to reduce burnout among physicians, residents, and medical students. Dr. Dyrbye is one of the country's leading experts on clinician well-being, a widely published scholar, and developer of the Well-Being Index, an interactive web-tool that provides a validated instrument for self-assessment, access to tailored resources, and organization level reports with comparisons to national norms.
