Discover answers to your questions by being a part of this small weekend sociometry workshop.

This is a rare opportunity to work with Barbara Guest Hargin, a Wise Elder in the psychodrama community, from Ontario, Canada. Barbara is part of the lineage of Ann E. Hale, having studied with Ann and with Donna Little at the Toronto Center.

The workshop is limited to no more than 12 participants.

TRAINING OBJECTIVES: Discover how skillful application of **sociometry** can promote the psychological and interpersonal container for connecting authentically in a relationship or group.

After completing this workshop, participants should be able to:

- Describe at least one sociometric tool for assessing group members' perceptions of inclusion in a group.
- Identify at least 3 sociometric configurations in groups and their significance.
- Explain the sociodynamic effect and its impact on small group functioning, as well as in larger social systems.
- Describe how to use at least one of the following for mapping individual or group concerns: *The Sociometric Cycle* (Hale); *The Healing Cycle* (Mosher) and/or *The Harmonic Cycle* (Hale) for mapping individual or group concerns.
- Identify the steps in the *Classical Psychodramatic Encounter* and differentiate them from those in the *Psychodramatic Intentional Dialogue*.

Although **sociometric theory** receives careful attention, the workshop is highly **interactive and experiential**. We invite intentional choice-making with clarity, authenticity and humaneness in the context of a weekend learning community.

Two highly skilled and experienced psychodrama trainers support the co-creation of a learning environment that promotes robust personal and professional growth and development.

She is the recipient of the 2019 ASGPP *Neil Passariello Award* for exemplary work in service of the communities affected by HIV/AIDS.
