ABOUT THE ENSEMBLE DIRECTOR

Saxophonist, composer, and educator **John Kocur** is Assistant Professor of Jazz Studies at George Mason University. He previously taught at Northern Virginia Community College where he directed the NOVA Nighthawks Jazz Ensemble. He services as a saxophonist with the 257th Army Band of the D.C. National Guard, "the Band of the Nation's Capital".

Kocur founded and is the current president of the Loudoun Jazz Society, a chapter of the Jazz Education Network. The society presents monthly jam sessions, open big band rehearsals, and networking events in Loudoun County, Virginia.

As a bandleader, he has released two albums of original music that received reviews in national media outlets. The John Kocur Quartet has performed at Blues Alley, Bohemian Caverns, Strathmore, the Kennedy Center Millennium Stage, and the DC Jazz Festival.

He holds a Bachelor of Music Degree from George Mason University and a Master of Music Degree from Howard University.
