Electronics Recycling Drive-Through Drop-Off Days Announced for 2021

The Cincinnati Recycling & Reuse Hub has announced upcoming dates for some of their electronics recycling events for 2021. All events are held, rain or shine, on Saturdays, from 10 AM until 2 PM at their warehouse location, 911 Evans Street, Cincinnati, Ohio 45204. The event dates are: April 10 & 24, and May 15 & 29. More dates will be released soon on their website www.cincinnatiirecyclingandreusehub.org and on their social media pages.

Residents from all areas of the Tri-State are encouraged to attend and almost all electronics are accepted. This includes all TVs (any size or type), refrigerators and all other household appliances (microwaves, washers, vacuum cleaners, etc.), cell phones, game systems, iPods, Blackberries, MP3 players, digital cameras, GPS units, e-readers, all computers and related accessories (such as keyboards, printers, portable hard drives, and scanners), VCR/DVD/CD players, fax machines, copiers, surge protectors, power cables and charging cords, electronic wiring, and satellite components.

TVs, computer monitors, refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, and air conditioners require per item drop-off fees to cover the disposal costs for the hazardous waste components of those items. Please see the Hub website for details on what the fees for each type of item are. All other items are accepted for a fee of \$10 per vehicle, which helps cover some of the other operating costs of the Hub. Credit cards will be accepted, but cash is preferred. (No checks accepted.) Electronics will also be accepted during regular Hub business hours.

Until further notice, COVID protocols will be in place and all individuals dropping items off are required to socially distance and wear face masks. Attendees will also be required to stay in their vehicles while going through the drop-off line.

RecycleForce, a non-profit from Indianapolis, will de-manufacture items and shred all hard drives to address any privacy concerns. The plastics, glass, and metals are then collected, packaged, and sold to build new components, while all toxic elements, such as lead and mercury, will be disposed of properly to avoid environmental contamination.

Materials handling equipment, safety equipment, and supplies for the Hub's 2021 electronics drop-off days were provided in part by a grant from the Hamilton County Recycling and Solid Waste District.
