Water Main Replacement Project

Greater Cincinnati Water Works (GCWW) has had a robust water main replacement program for many years with project planning and construction continuing to move north into your neighborhood. In response to recent incidents and City of Cincinnati Council Emergency Ordinance No. 202000018, GCWW is expediting this project to replace water mains in your area.

Benefits Include:

- Fewer potential water main breaks or leaks
- Improved water system reliability
- Increased water supply
- New fire hydrants

What is involved?

The water main replacement project will include three phases:

1. Utility Survey
2. Engineering Design
3. Construction

What should customers expect?

- Surveyors will be locating and marking all underground utilities in the area (with various colored spray paint). This includes water, sewer, gas, and electric.
- This information is used to design the location of the new water main, valves, and fire hydrants, which will be different than the current water main, valve, and fire hydrant locations.
- No interruptions to water service are expected during this phase of the project.
- Information on how to participate in GCWW's Lead Service Line Replacement Program during this project will be provided prior to construction. To learn more about lead and drinking water, visit Lead.myGCWW.org.

Project Timeline

- Survey work will begin soon (February - April 2020) and is expected to last 3-4 weeks (weather permitting).
- This phase involves utility survey and engineering design to be completed in July of 2020.
- The construction phase will follow through summer of 2021.
- GCWW will make periodic visits to the site during the design phase to determine the best locations for the new water main, valves, and fire hydrants.

Traffic Restrictions

- Traffic disruptions may be necessary; however, they are expected to be minimal at this time. The Contractor will maintain access for emergency vehicles, school buses, Metro bus service, and pedestrians at all times.
- You will receive additional notifications prior to the start of the construction phase of the project.
