It is a symbol of excellence that can bolster resumes, college applications and scholarship applications. Winning a Scholastic Art & Writing Award offers the opportunity for scholarships on both regional and national levels. The Scholastic Awards look for work that demonstrates originality, technical skill,

and emergence of a personal voice or vision. Notable past award winners include: Andy Warhol, Sylvia Plath, Joyce Carol Oates, Truman Capote, John Updike, Stephen King, and many more.

To enter:

- 1. Check with your teacher for specific class submission deadlines.
- 2. Create an online account at: http://www.artandwriting.org/affiliate/PA004W/. Note that you will need your teacher's email address.
- 3. Choose a category or categories for submission. Every category has specific requirements so please read the Guidelines and Category Descriptions carefully.
- 4. Complete your work and submit online.
- 5. After uploading your work, print your submission forms and <u>have a parent/guardian and your teacher sign them.</u>
- 6. Include your Submission Fee with your submission form and give to your teacher by the required deadline. Late submissions cannot be accepted. **Submission fees are \$5.00 per individual submission**. Please make checks payable to: Commonwealth Charter Academy Students for whom submission fees would be a barrier to participation may request a fee waiver. Please have a parent or guardian sign the Fee Waiver Form. Include the fee waiver form with your registration.

Timeline/ Awards:

- → See your teacher for the class-specific deadline; Trinity must have all signed submission forms and fees NO LATER THAN Monday Dec. 18th. Late forms will not be submitted to Scholastic Writing Awards; the contest adheres to a strict deadline.
- → Winners will be announced the first week of February.
- → The regional awards ceremony will take place on March 10, 2018 at The State Museum in Harrisburg. This event is by invite only for winning students, families and educators.
- → A student who is awarded a Gold Key on a local level automatically moves to the national competition; national winners are recognized at an event in New York City.
- → Students may also be awarded a SIlver Key on a local level; these do not move on to the national level but are eligible for regional scholarship awards.
