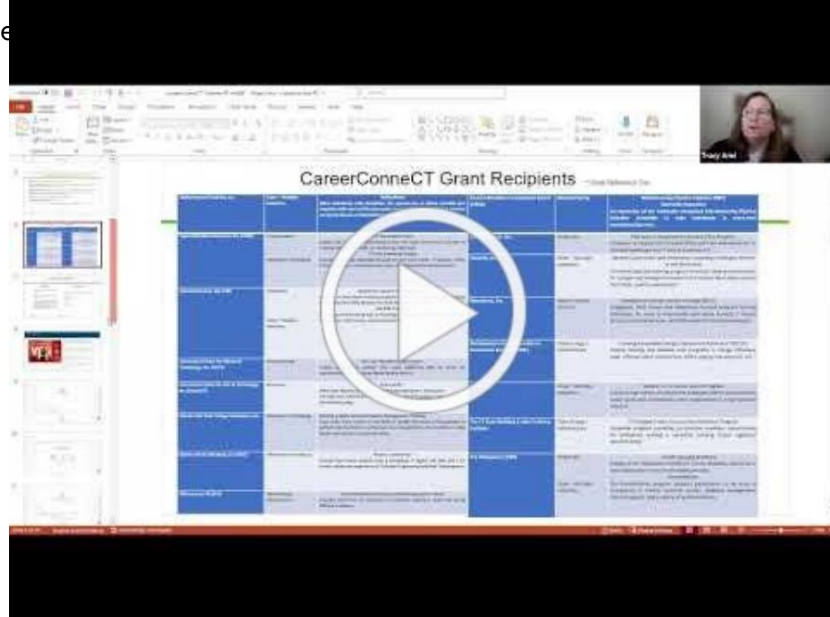

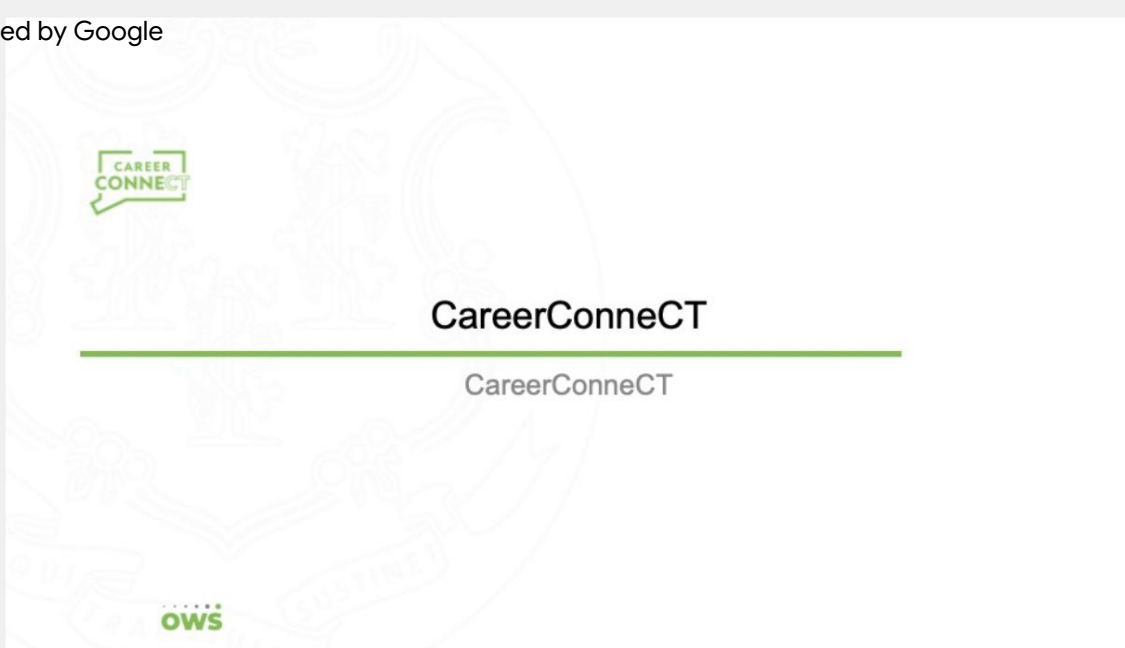

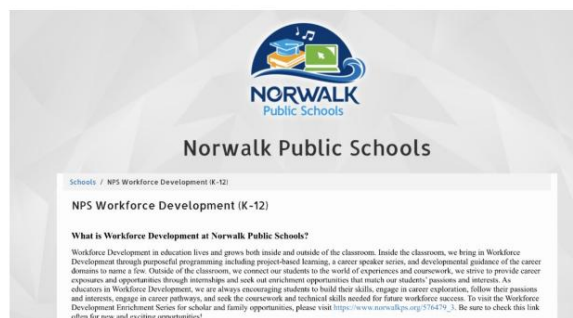

El proyecto CT Statewide Healthcare Industry Pathways (CT SHIP) es un proyecto financiado por una subvención del SCC de 4 años. Durante el período del proyecto, que se extiende desde el 1 de febrero de 2021 hasta el 30 de enero de 2025, se espera que CT SHIP capacite a aproximadamente 2200 estudiantes.

El proyecto busca abordar las disparidades en el logro de credenciales postsecundarias en función de la raza/etnicidad y los ingresos familiares que impiden que Connecticut logre sus objetivos generales de vitalidad económica y mayores oportunidades de empleo.

About the Grant

In February 2021, the U.S. Department of Labor (USDOL) Education and Training Administration (ETA) awarded \$40M for the Strengthening Community Colleges Training Grants program to 11 colleges nationwide. Norwalk Community College is the lead institution for the grant funded project called CT Statewide Healthcare Industry Pathways (CT SHIP). The total cost of CT SHIP is \$6.9M. \$3.4M (49%) is funded through a U.S. Department of Labor - ETA grant and another \$3.5M (51%) is committed through non-federal state and local resources. With Norwalk Community College as the lead institution, the five consortium college partners include Gateway CC, Houatonic CC, Middlesex CC and Tunxis CC.

"The Strengthening Community Colleges Training Grants will play an important role in helping workers to retrain as quickly as possible with industry-recognized credentials and accelerated pathways to degrees," said Assistant Secretary for Employment and Training John Pallasch. "These grants are among the range of actions the Department is taking to aid American workers and employers as our nation combats the coronavirus pandemic."

The legislature's Higher Education and Employment Advancement Committee convened to discuss the work, approving a series of bills designed to promote workforce development and lower the cost of post-secondary education.

SB 2451, which creates a fee credit for a preceptor who provides clinical placements for nursing students, was among the featured bills.

Under the bill, a \$1,000 credit may be claimed for every 100 clinical placement hours, provided the preceptor does not at the same time claim a credit for higher education and is the only credit claimed against the liability.

The credit may not exceed \$4,000 in any taxable year.

Proponents of the bill, which the committee approved unanimously, expect that this approach will help reduce bottlenecks in most community-based clinical placements.
