CT CRADLE TO CAREER COALITION
APRIL 30, 2025 POLICY STATUS

10 COALITION MEMBERS SUBMITTED TESTIMONY ON 22 BILLS, 6 TESTIFIED LIVE

- ◆ **FINANCE, REVENUE, and BONDING COMMITTEE bill provides:**
 - Child Tax Credit:** Creates a permanent, refundable credit of \$150 per child for a maximum of three children, or \$450 per year
- ◆ **APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE BUDGET for FY 26-27 includes:**
 - Economically Disadvantaged Youth:** Maintains funding of \$5 million in both fiscal years for the Connecticut's Youth Employment Program
 - School Meals:** Provides free meals to students who qualify for reduced-price meals in both fiscal years
 - Special Education:** Provides historic increase in Excess Cost grant funding and Establishes grant to incentivize creation of in-district programs
 - Education Cost Sharing:** Completes the ECS formula phase-in schedule
- ◆ **BILLS MOVING IN HOUSE and SENATE or on their CALENDARS**
 - Youth Disconnection:** Creation of a three-year student success coach pilot program
 - Medicaid:** Rate increases and Community Health Worker reimbursement activation
 - Early Care and Education:** Universal Pre-K, increased funding for high-quality care from 0-5 and their providers
 - Benefits Cliff:** Implementation of income disregards for certain pilot programs and trainings
 - Housing:** Expansion of eviction protections

WHAT ARE THE BASICS PRINCIPLES?

Science shows that 80% of brain growth happens by the age of three! Beginning from birth, young brains develop like little muscles, getting bigger and stronger the more you and your family interact with your child.

The Basics Principles are five fun, simple, and powerful ways to help all our children aged 0-3 grow to be happy and smart.

Do all five principles every day to help your child become the amazing person you know they can be.

**Maximize Love, Manage Stress**

Babies and toddlers thrive when their world feels loving, safe, and predictable. Respond with smiles, words, and touch to help them see, hear, and feel your love. You will help them develop a sense of security and self-control.

**Talk, Sing, and Point**

Babies learn language from the moment they are born. Respond to their sounds, and later, their words. Connect with eye contact and a loving tone of voice, while pointing to help them know what you are talking about.

**Count, Group, and Compare**

Every child's brain is wired for math. Talk about numbers, shapes, patterns, and comparisons as you go about your routines together. Watch your child learn to love math.

**Explore Through Movement and Play**

Babies are like scientists who love making discoveries. Watch to see what interests your child, then encourage their curiosity and help them learn when they play and explore.

**Read and Discuss Stories**

Reading turns kids into confident thinkers. Make books a regular part of your relationship from the very beginning. With infants, point at the pictures and speak with excitement. With toddlers, just make it fun.
