Remove food sources

- Do not ground feed animals
- Keep garbage cans in good condition

Remove water sources

- Look for and remove sources of standing water in your yard

Remove shelter sources

- Keep landscaping well maintained
- Keep wood piles tightly stacked and away from sides of buildings

Are you concerned about fire or fall hazards in your home? A Wauwatosa Fire Education Coordinator and a Public Health Nurse are available for FREE home visits to determine fall and fire risks at home for Wauwatosa residents. Those that participate will receive a free motion sensor nightlight, an oven stick, and free smoke detector installation (if applicable).
