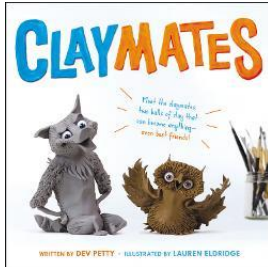


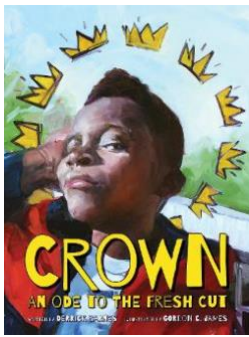
Top 10 Reads for Spring Break 2018

Please note the appropriate grade level for each book. These are not requirements, simply suggestions for an enjoyable activity over Spring Break!



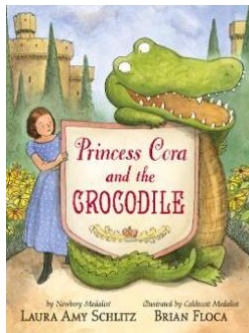
Claymates by Dev Petty

You will be unable to resist these two friends as they transform themselves with hilarious commentary. Bring out the playdough this spring break and make your very own Claymates together! (Picture Book)



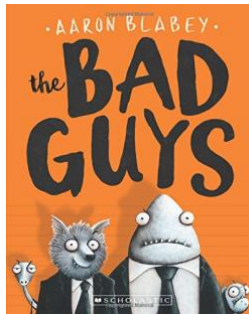
Crown: An Ode to the Fresh Cut by Derrick Barnes

Unhappy queen-in-training Cora receives a pet crocodile from her fairy godmother, who disrupts her mundane daily routine. (Grades 1-3)

The War I Finally Won by Kimberly Brubaker Bradley

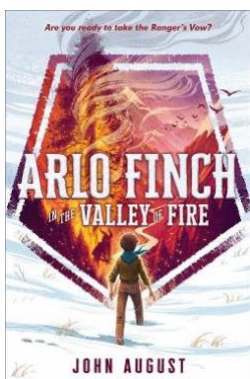

Virgil has gone missing! The paths of four sixth graders cross in this Newbery Award Winner, with heart, humor, and adventure. (Grades 4-6)

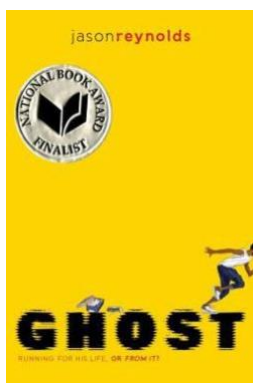
