Joe Archino, Superintendent, Irvington Recreation, in cooperation with the Senior Center is providing and coordinating delivery of bagged groceries for Irvington seniors. They are servicing 90 seniors in need and have provided over 500 bags of food. They have spent over \$15,000 on food to date.

COMMUNITY FOOD PANTRY OF SLEEPY HOLLOW & TARRYTOWN (also services Irvington) The pantry has seen a record breaking number of clients - 350 families (about 1,400 people). Also, they are distributing food twice a month instead of once a month. Each regular distribution costs \$6,000 & each emergency supplemental distribution costs \$3,000. Food is available for people in need in Irvington, Tarrytown & Sleepy Hollow pantry distribution dates/times are listed below:
