

SUNDAY MORNING PROGRAMS (9:30 – 10:15am)

Nursery (Room 201, 9:15-11:30am)

Our trained nursery employees, along with congregational volunteers, create a nurturing and Christ-centered experience as the children from birth through three years of age begin to develop their worship routines.



Preschool Class (Room 208)

We welcome our 3 and 4 year olds to the Sunday School experience! This class uses a play-based curriculum which features age-appropriate play spaces, prayers, storytelling, music, and rituals.

Kindergarten – Grade 2 Class (Room 209)

Our teachers use “Growing in Grace and Gratitude,” a Presbyterian Church (USA) children’s curriculum. This series will help children learn to worship and serve God in grateful ways.

Grades 3-5 Class (Room 100)

This class focuses on Old and New Testament stories; learning the books of the Bible and Bible verses. Students practice the Kyrie, Doxology, Lord’s Prayer, Gloria Patri, and Apostle’s Creed, allowing them to participate fully in worship. We will be studying a curriculum entitled “We Believe” (PCUSA).

Youth Sunday School Class

(Room 106) Grades 6-12 use curricula designed to address the questions and concerns of this age group through discussion and reflection.



Children’s Chapel (Following Children’s Message - Room 211)

Except for the first Sunday of each month, children 4-years-old through 2nd grade are invited to leave the morning worship service after the Children’s Message to experience God’s presence in their special chapel with “The Godly Play” curriculum. Bible stories are introduced and explored using three-dimensional materials. Then the children are encouraged to reflect on the story by responding to ‘wondering questions’ followed by personal response time.

ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASSES

Lectionary Class (Fellowship Hall)

Each Sunday, adults are invited to read and reflect on the lectionary scriptures upon which that Sunday’s sermon is based. Come enjoy relaxed conversations about God’s Word and its message.

Parlor Class (Church Parlor - Room 207)

This year the Parlor class will explore the National Geographic DVD course, *The History and Archaeology of the Bible*. The focus of this study begins before Abram and extends to the rise of Christianity after the resurrection. Come learn about the places and people of the Bible. Adults of all ages are encouraged to join the lively discussion.

Biblical Justice Forum (meets virtually Mondays at 12:00pm)

Adults in this class study current issues of concern to Christians, such as racial injustice, nonviolence, environmental justice, treatment of migrants, etc. and attempt to discern the church’s obligations regarding these topics.

Youth Fellowship (Fellowship Hall)

Youth in grades 6-12 meet Sunday evenings for a shared meal, study and activities designed to enhance their recognition of and understanding of God’s work in their lives and their work in the lives of others. This very active group will assist in designing the syllabus for each semester. Meals are provided by parents.

ADDITIONAL OFFERINGS

Wednesday Morning Bible Study (9:30-11:00am – Fellowship Hall)

This very busy, discussion-oriented group, open to any age, meets every Wednesday morning. Time is divided between prayer and Bible Study. Prayer is a centerpiece of our meeting time, and we welcome all requests. Prayer time is followed by study of the scriptures as they inform our discipleship. We also receive weekly food donations from the congregation and deliver them each month to the Urban Ministries Food Pantry. Please join us for a wonderful time and make new friends!



Adult Bible Study (meets virtually Thursdays at 6:30pm)

All adults are welcome to join this study of the scriptures using an inductive study method. Participants observe what they see in the scriptures, interpret what it means, and seek to apply the message to today’s world.

Presbyterian Women (Church Parlor at 10:00am - Room 207)

The purpose of Presbyterian Women calls women to nurture faith through prayer and Bible study. The Horizons Bible Study created for Presbyterian Women is the curriculum used. This year the study will be *Celebrating Sabbath, Accepting God's Gift of Rest and Delight*. Presbyterian Women is open to ALL women in the Church. Circle meets on the second Tuesday of each month. The ladies meet in the Parlor at 10:00am for business, Bible Study, and then lunch together in a nearby restaurant.

The preschool also promotes the sharing of cultures and family experiences to further develop each child's acceptance of him/herself along with a positive awareness of others.
