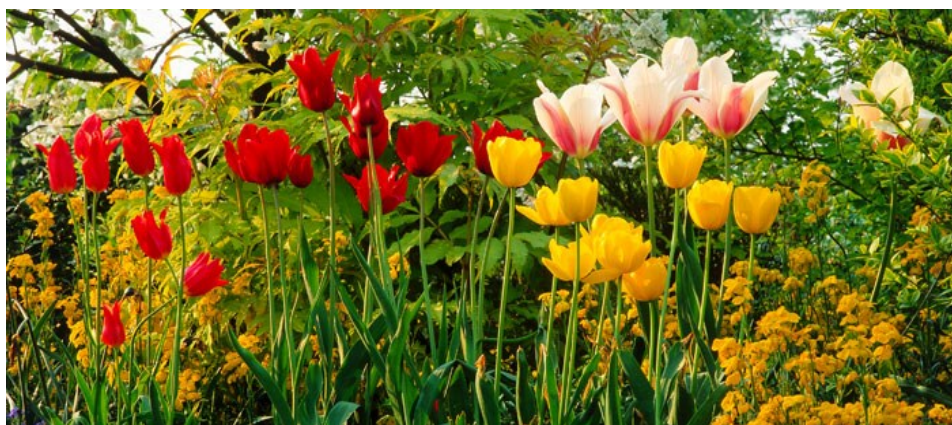

None of the biblical accounts explains how the Resurrection took place. The Gospel writers say nothing about how the stone was rolled away or what happened to bring Jesus back to life. Did his heart just begin beating and the other organs gradually restart? Did the Resurrection occur instantly or over a period of several hours?

None of these questions is answered. The scripture simply tells us that people at Jesus' tomb were seeking the living among the dead. Perhaps the Bible is telling us something important by leaving out the details: God is at work even when we can't see God in action. God is still doing something when we think God is done. Most importantly, the Easter story communicates by its lack of detail that we don't have to understand how God works in order for God to work.

The women who went to the tomb on Easter morning expected to find a dead body. They did not expect a miracle but kept living faithfully and demonstrated their devotion. In the process, they experienced renewed hope and ran to share it with others.

Even when we don't feel like it, we can act on our faith, serve others, give generously, and worship faithfully. In this way, we put ourselves in a position to experience what God can do—what God is already doing.

The Missionary Community: Life in the Arabian Peninsula

This anonymous account comes from a missionary family who must protect their identity due to the places in which they serve.

I gained my faith in the Lord while growing up in Greenville. I now live in the Arabian Peninsula with my young family. Our goal is to see the story of the redemptive love of Jesus brought to this region and see the lost given an opportunity to hear about Christ, study his Word, and commit their lives to following him. We do this by living our daily lives in a city where the local population essentially has no Christians and are considered unreached with the gospel. The term “unreached” means there is currently no local church of believers who can share about Jesus with their own people. The vision the Lord has placed in our hearts is to see the local people come to faith in Jesus, begin to share about him and disciple their own people. Because of the nature of this country, we have to have local jobs in order to remain in the country. These jobs provide us a contextual reason to be in the country and also gifts us with many relationships with locals who often become our friends. Through our friendships with locals, we seek to live out Christ’s love and also speak about Him and our faith in Him as much as possible. It is through these conversations that we start to teach people more about Jesus and His love. The work we do in the Arabian Peninsula is an exercise in patience and trust in the Lord but we are confident in God’s love for the people there and we believe in his ability to welcome these people into his kingdom.

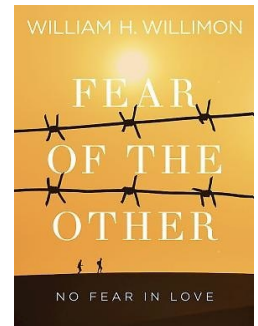
