*22 The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end;
23 they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. Lamentations 3:22-23*

This is a call to pray, every day, in the days leading up to the special Called General Conference (Feb 23-26) in St. Louis, Missouri. Delegates from around the world will consider the recommendations of The Commission On The Way Forward. This is not a prayer vigil. There is no limit on how many times you may pray during the day. The important thing to realize is how important prayer is in our life together. Remember, “the Church is of God and shall be preserved to the end of time,” therefore, we pray in a spirit of hope-filled surrender. “Thy will be done,” Jesus prayed, and so we follow his practice of seeking God’s will first. We pray, seeking to hear a word from God, and aligning ourselves with the will of God. Below is a simple guide to assist each of us in faithfully seeking God’s direction in the coming days. You are invited to begin with a prayer John Wesley and the early Methodist’s embraced in their shared life, A Covenant Prayer.

A Covenant Prayer in the Wesleyan Tradition (Contemporary Version)

O Lord, I am no longer my own, but yours. Put me to what you will, place me with whom you will. Put me to doing, put me to suffering. Let me be put to work for you or set aside for you, Praised for you or criticized for you. Let me be full, let me be empty. Let me have all things, let me have nothing. I freely and fully surrender all things to your glory and service. And now, O wonderful and holy God, Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer, you are mine, and I am yours. So be it. And the covenant which I have made on earth, Let it also be made in heaven. Amen.

Pray whenever you have the opportunity. If possible, mark each day on your calendar and pray from 2:23 pm - 2:26 pm (as a reminder - the dates for General Conference are Feb 23-26).

How can we pray? We are encouraged to practice prayer, as well as prayer with fasting. In keeping with the early Methodist’s, we encourage you to consider fasting from Thursday sundown to mid-afternoon on Friday. Fasting may be a temporary refraining from food, or social media, or television, or whatever you choose. As Marjorie Thompson notes: “Fasting and prayer, . . . seem to be two of the most effective tools in clearing away our self-preoccupation so we can be more responsive to God’s life in and through and around us.” To learn more about John Wesley’s practice of prayer and fasting visit:

4. Pray for all of the delegations from all over the world for safe travel and strength and wisdom to faithfully seek God's Will.
5. Pray for the movement of the Holy Spirit to guide the gathering so that all that is discussed and decided will have only one function; to bring honor to God in all that is said and done.
6. Pray for God's love and understanding to flow in and through our Jarvis Memorial church family, and to be evident in all our interactions.

May the peace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with us, wherever he may send us; may he guide us through the wilderness and protect us through the storm, may he bring us home rejoicing at the wonders he has shown us. This is our prayer in the Blessed name of Jesus who was, and is, and shall be, forever the same. Amen.

General Conference - February 2019

The General Conference of the United Methodist Church is slated to gather February 23 to February 26 in St. Louis, Missouri. The governing or executive arm of our world-wide United Methodist Church is called, General Conference. Typically this body convenes once every four years to discern God's Vision for the church and to set our shared missional agenda. A special meeting called the General Conference is slated for February 23-26, 2019 in St Louis, Missouri to discern our Church's position on ordination of persons identifying as LGBTQ and on whether the church will sanction same sex unions; neither of which are currently sanctioned. General Conference is a gathering of approximately 900 delegates (half are clergy and half are laity) from all over the world. Bishops, while helping to preside at General Conference, have no vote. The North Carolina Conference (think eastern half of our state) will be sending sixteen (16) delegates to GC 2019. General Conference is part of a three-pronged organizational structure to ensure the Church stays true to our mission. Like our own US government there is an Executive (General Conference), Administrative (Council of Bishops) and Judicial (Judicial Council) branch of leadership. 
2018 Points to Celebrate

- \$185,123 in apportionments were paid in full
- As a congregation we gave more than \$185,000 to other benevolences. This includes \$17,700 to UMCOR and \$11,600 for the Sound District Christmas Eve Offering.
- We began to accept gifts online in 2016. We received more than \$150,000 from online giving in 2018.


2019 Numbers to Know
