Share the Plate for April 15, 2018: Service Never Sleeps

Starting this Sunday, April 15 through Saturday, April 21, midnight, all funds donated to Share the Plate will go to UUCA's social justice partner, **Service Never Sleeps**.

As part of the Unitarian Universalist Church of Arlington's (UUCA) Live the Pledge commitment to work to end racism – UUCA is partnering with Service Never Sleeps. SNS is a nonprofit in Arlington dedicated to their signature workshop called “Allyship.”

Allyship is about moving people to a new paradigm of thinking about privilege and marginalized communities. Allyship promotes the idea that we can be bridge-builders who work together and support each other toward the common purpose of ensuring equality, equity, and inclusion for everyone.

The workshop teaches about the causes of social injustice, how to be an effective ally for marginalized communities, and how to actively influence and educate others.
