The city of Long Beach has launched a new tab on its Homelessness Services and Information Hub website detailing the city's response efforts for the homelessness state of emergency. The new tab, available at longbeach.gov/homelessness, will offer a one-stop-shop for city news, data, and resources surrounding the homelessness crisis and will also support the city's efforts to provide timely, transparent information to the public.

The Emergency Response tab will be updated regularly and includes the following information:

- Synopsis and mission statement for the emergency proclamation.
- A link to the newly launched [data dashboard](#).
- A list of notable activities related to the emergency.
- Updates to the Long Beach City Council, including presentations and recordings.
- A list of emergency response livestreams hosted by Mayor Richardson.
- Frequently asked questions, available in English, Spanish, Khmer, and Tagalog, regarding new programs and shelter sites.
