## The Lessons

### **The First Reading**

**A Reading from the Book of Exodus, chapter 12, beginning at the first verse:**

The LORD said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt: This month shall mark for you the beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year for you. Tell the whole congregation of Israel that on the tenth of this month they are to take a lamb for each family, a lamb for each household. If a household is too small for a whole lamb, it shall join its closest neighbor in obtaining one; the lamb shall be divided in proportion to the number of people who eat of it. This is how you shall eat it: your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and you shall eat it hurriedly. It is the passover of the LORD. For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike down every firstborn in the land of Egypt, both human beings and animals; on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgments: I am the LORD. The blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you live: when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague shall destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt.

This day shall be a day of remembrance for you. You shall celebrate it as a festival to the LORD; throughout your generations you shall observe it as a perpetual ordinance.



## +The Holy Gospel

**Reader:** The Holy Gospel of our Savior Jesus Christ according to John.

**People:** **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

Now before the festival of the Passover, Jesus knew that his hour had come to depart from this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end. The devil had already put it into the heart of Judas son of Simon Iscariot to betray him. And during supper Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he had come from God and was going to God, got up from the table, took off his outer robe, and tied a towel around himself. Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was tied around him. He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, "Lord, are you going to wash my feet?" Jesus answered, "You do not know now what I am doing, but later you will understand." Peter said to him, "You will never wash my feet." Jesus answered, "Unless I wash you, you have no share with me." Simon Peter said to him, "Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and my head!" Jesus said to him, "One who has bathed does not need to wash, except for the feet, but is entirely clean. And you are clean, though not all of you." For he knew who was to betray him; for this reason he said, "Not all of you are clean."

After he had washed their feet, had put on his robe, and had returned to the table, he said to them, "Do you know what I have done to you? You call me Teacher and Lord--and you are right, for that is what I am. So if I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have set you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you. Very truly, I tell you, servants are not greater than their master, nor are messengers greater than the one who sent them. If you know these things, you are blessed if you do them.

Jesus said, "Now the Son of Man has been glorified, and God has been glorified in him. If God has been glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself and will glorify him at once. Little children, I am with you only a little longer. You will look for me; and as I said to the Jews so now I say to you, 'Where I am going, you cannot come.' I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

## The Washing of Feet

*Presider:* Fellow servants of our Lord Jesus Christ: On the night before his death, Jesus set an example for his disciples by washing their feet, an act of humble service. He taught that strength and growth in the life of the Kingdom of God come not by power, authority, or even miracle, but by such lowly service. We all need to remember his example, but none stand more in need of this reminder than those whom the Lord has called to the ordained ministry.

Therefore, I invite you who share in the royal priesthood of Christ, to come forward, that we may all follow the example of our loving Master. Come remembering his admonition that what will be done for you is also to be done by you to others, for “a servant is not greater than his master, nor is one who is sent greater than the one who sent him. If you know these things, blessed are you if you do them.”

*The congregation is invited to come forward for the washing of the feet. Please remove your shoes and socks, before coming forward, and leave them in your pew. (Removing one shoe and sock is sufficient, if you prefer.) As a symbol of Christ’s servitude, and as a symbol of our own servanthood, and love for one another, the people first have their feet washed, and then wash the feet of the next person to come forward. After washing the feet of your fellow worshipper, you may return to your pew and put on your shoe(s) and sock(s).*

Presider: The Gifts of God for the People of God, offered in remembrance that Christ died for you. Feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

**Healing Prayers offered:** *Prayers for healing of body, mind, or spirit, and/or prayers of thanksgiving for yourself or others, are available from the healing prayer ministry during communion. Simply go to the space next to the baptismal font and make your request known.*

*Wherever you are in your spiritual journey, you are welcome at God's table.*

*All are invited to participate in the Sacrament of Christ's Body and Blood, or Holy Communion, at All Saints'. You may partake of the consecrated bread or the consecrated wine, or both, or neither. Here's how:*

*At the direction of the ushers, come forward to the Minister of the Bread and cup your hands, palms up and extend them to the Minister. They will say these words of offering, "The Body of Christ, the bread of heaven," and place the consecrated wafer in your upturned palms. The response is, "Amen." Consume the wafer immediately. If you do not wish to partake of the consecrated bread, cross your hands over your chest to indicate you would prefer a blessing.*

*Proceed to the Minister of the Cup who will extend the chalice of consecrated wine and say, "The Blood of Christ, the cup of salvation." Again, the response is, "Amen." Then, there are **three** ways to participate in the administration of the consecrated wine:*

- *You may take a sip of the wine directly from the chalice. (The minister will keep holding the stem of the chalice, while you guide the bowl of the chalice to your lips to take a sip. Afterwards, the minister will carefully wipe the rim of the chalice and rotate it for the next person.)*
- *Or you may reach forward and lightly touch the foot of the chalice.*
- *Or you may cross your arms over your chest, be presented the cup. Respond "Amen," and return to your seat.*

**For health safety reasons there is no Intinction (dipping of the bread into the wine) at this time.**

*Be assured that the full benefits of the Sacrament are conferred when either the consecrated bread or the consecrated wine are received. How ever you choose to participate in the Sacrament, we thank you for joining us at God's table.*

10. I have been entrusted to you ever since I was born; \*  
you were my God when I was still in my mother's womb.
11. Be not far from me, for trouble is near, \*  
and there is none to help.

13. They open wide their jaws at me, \*

my tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth; \*

19. Save me from the sword, \*

my wretched body from the horns of wild bulls.
21. I will declare your Name to the community; \*  
in the midst of the congregation I will praise you.
22. Praise the Lord, you that are God-fearing; \*  
stand in awe of the Lord, O offspring of Israel;  
all you of Jacob's line, give glory.

23. For the Lord does not despise nor abhor the poor in their poverty;  
neither is the Lord's face hidden from them; \*  
but when they cry out, the Lord hears them.
24. My praise is of God in the great assembly; \*  
I will perform my vows in the presence of those who worship the Lord.
25. The poor shall eat and be satisfied,  
and those who seek the Lord shall give praise: \*  
"May your heart live for ever!"
26. All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to God, \*  
and all the families of the nations shall bow before the Lord.
27. For sovereignty belongs to the Lord; \*  
who rules over the nations.
28. To the Lord alone all who sleep in the earth bow down in worship; \*  
all who go down to the dust fall before the Lord.
29. My soul shall live for God;  
my descendants shall serve the Lord; \*  
they shall be known as the Lord's for ever.
30. They shall come and make known to a people yet unborn \*  
the saving deeds that God has done.
