



- Applications for FY26/27 opens in January 2025.

### \* Current Council priorities:

- 1) Workforce Development
- 2) Youth Gun Violence Reduction
- 3) Housing stability / homelessness prevention

FY25 = \$8.5MM

Applications for Human Services Funding are reviewed by the Mayor-appointed, 20-member Human Services Advisory Committee (HSAC).

HSAC members serve a 3-year term, must disclose any conflicts of interest, and meet monthly throughout the year to review project updates, emerging community needs, and refinements to the process.
