These scholarships are creating an investment in our students right at the beginning of their artistic and academic career, thanks to donations through Monterey County Gives!

This scholarship empowers local youth to achieve their dreams and contribute to the county's creative vitality and rich artistic heritage upon graduation. Career opportunities in creative fields are growing and varied, from design (graphic design, architecture) to digital arts (filmmaking, game design, photography), literature to performing arts to visual arts (including crafts such as ceramics).
