Role overview

Stewardship advocates strengthen the stewardship ministry of your meeting/church by helping to integrate faith and stewardship principles with the needs of your meeting and its Friends.

This role is an opportunity to:

- Deepen the stewardship life
- Provide practical help
- Expand the reach of your caring community
- Accompany others through life's stages

Ministry activities

- Assist the meeting in stewardship education resources and events
- Stay informed through advocate training activities
- Connect Friends to Everence services and benefit programs
- Help inspire stewardship within the meeting
- Regularly report stewardship activities

Gifts of an advocate

- Desires to help meet stewardship needs in the meeting
- Works well with pastor, clerk and/or the meeting's caring network

- Helps others to integrate faith with financial decisions
- Is willing to volunteer one or two hours per month
- Is willing to serve two or three years

Selection/appointment process*

1. Advocates are selected by the meeting.
2. Meetings may consult with their Everence stewardship consultant about the advocate role or appointment process.
