TESTING

Grade 9-12: We tested almost 200 students for the PSAT on Oct. 15th. You will be notified when the results arrive in January. You will then be able to log onto the www.collegeboard.org site and utilizing the Khan Academy free test prep, hone your skills for the spring SAT.

College Board offers a wealth of information and personalized tools to help students with the college admissions process. Selected students, based on their performance on the PSAT will receive mailings on: A personalized college starter list, college applications, financial aid and scholarships, college application fee waivers, one-on-one virtual advising, and access to more opportunities.

Register for the SAT and ACT must be completed on the www.collegeboard.org and the www.actstudent.org sites. Registration for these tests should be completed at least two months before the test date to reserve the testing site you prefer. Dates: ACT- 2/11/17, 4/8/17 and SAT-1/21/17, 3/11/17. Our school code is 030-124

Test prep: Princeton Review www.PrincetonReview.com, Kaplan kaptest.com/psatcram, www.collegeboard.org, and Khan Academy all offering test prep. Khan Academy has partnered with College Board and offers free test prep. Get ready for these tests. Your scores on these tests and your GPA in your college prep courses are the top two factors college admissions reps consider.

COLLEGE & SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

Arizona's participation in the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education (WICHE) Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) provides the opportunity for students to attend a public college, at the undergraduate level outside of Arizona, at a reduced level of tuition (150% of the host institution's resident tuition.) The WICHE member states are: Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Commonwealth of Northern Mariana Islands, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington and Wyoming. Interested applicants should check the WICHE website at: http://www.wiche.edu/wue to search participating institutions by program of study.

Student Athletes: If you are planning to play college sports at the Division I or II level, you must register with the **National Clearinghouse (NCAA)** during your sophomore year (10th grade). Check on their site to confirm you are taking the courses you need to not only graduate from Fountain Hills and get into the college, but are eligible through their organization. For example, the do not accept on-line courses. Choose classes wisely.

ASU UPDATES

Students can still apply to ASU. Students and parents should create their <u>FSA</u> (Federal Student Aid) login and file their Free Application for Federal Student Aid as soon as possible. With the FAFSA available early this year and families being able to use their previous year's tax information, the whole admission process is easier and can be completed earlier. Here's how the changes help families: When families file the 2017-2018 FAFSA, they will use their 2015 tax returns, which are already done. It cuts down on the number of families selected for verification. Families hear from colleges and universities sooner about their complete financial aid package.

NAU UPDATES

Regarding STAR, Honors, and CCC2NAU: STAR: Applications opened on October 1, 2016 with a Priority Deadline of February 1, 2017. To apply, the students must follow the steps below:

HONORS: There is no deadline to apply to Honors, but we strongly encourage submitting application materials prior to March 1. If you would like to live in Ernest Calderon Learning Community (this date allows us to review and process your application for Honors in enough time in advance of Calderon room placement); May 1 is their priority date to ensure enrollment in our first year Honors seminar. In order to be in the running for Honors Scholarships, students will need to complete the honors application by November 14.

CCC2NAU: Due to high demand, residential hall space will not be available for CCC2NAU students for the 2017-2018 academic year. There will be alternative housing options available.

Grade 12: Seniors use parchment to request transcripts. Log into your parchment.com account School Code: 030-124. Students click "sign-up. I don't have a registration code."

Grade 12: Seniors, need letters of recommendation for university admissions? If you are using the Common Application, you will need them. The counselor letter of recommendation is part of the Secondary School Report. Please complete the student (and parent) Brag Sheets online: FHHS Website, Counseling Department, Career Development. Then, make an appointment with Miss Phillips for an interview, and give her 1-2 weeks after the interview to write your letter of recommendation. Don't forget to say thank you for this favor!

Grades 9-12/parents: We encourage you to review grades on-line and attendance weekly, with your student. If you have any questions or concerns, contact your child's teacher immediately.

Grades 9-10: Student support groups for study skills will be taking place during semester 1. The counseling department will expand the support group options during semester 2.

The National Honors Society offers after school tutoring on Wednesdays during lunch and on Thursdays after school in room B104, the Homework Hub room.

Power Hour: Tutoring is also available from all teachers. The teachers are the best source of tutoring assistance. Another teacher of the same subject can help as well.

Naviance: Naviance's web-based software as a service platform provides students with a variety of features, including college research and matching tools, course planning, career assessment, and personality tests, and surveys to help students connect what they are doing in school to what they would like to do once they complete their education. Naviance provides additional functionality to school counselors to track the progress of individual students, communicate and collaborate with students and families, or create reports on their entire student population. Additionally, Naviance's integration with "The Common Application" facilitates the submission of college applications, as well as online submission of transcripts, school forms and recommendations through Naviance eDocs.

Parents/Guardians will also have a log in. We will be having a parent information night early 2nd semester (TBD).

Pre-ACT: This coming March, the FHHS Counseling Department will offer the Pre-ACT to all 10th and 11th graders. The test is designed for student who are taking 10th grade level curriculum, but we are opening the test to 11th graders, as well, who wish to better prepare for the April, 2017 ACT.

The Pre-ACT test can be used to predict student performance on the ACT, and the student reports offer a visual depiction of students' educational and career journey based on academic and career interests. The cost for the Pre-ACT is \$15, and the counseling department will be providing more details after school resumes in January.
