Here is a bit of an update on Michigan's standing with the NAC Future Practice Workgroup (FPW). As you know, our state joined this group with the goal to increase diversity and equity in our profession, in addition to highlighting the importance of architecture as a profession as we move towards 2030.

After our conference call last week – the workgroup has opted to move forward with the proposal put forth by Michigan and Illinois and will be sending it to the CEP and National to be considered for the theme / focus of the National Emerging Professional Exhibit for 2020. Please see a draft of the proposed abstract below:

As young architects and emerging professionals, what does the future practice of architecture look like in an environment and civilization facing issues of a rapidly changing climate? Lester Brown, in his work <u>Plan B 3.0 – Mobilizing to Save Civilization</u>, calls out issues of deteriorating oil and food security, rising temperatures and seas, emerging water shortages and natural systems under stress all as being relevant hurdles to be overcome in our near future. Has your work, implemented or conceptual, addressed any of these topics or their tangential byproducts [IE. Cutting Carbon, Losing Soil, Disappearing Plants and Animals, Poverty, etc.]?

Here is to hoping that we see some traction on the focus with regards to national! Additionally, the Young Architects Forum (YAF) is looking to highlight EPs from around the country who are doing innovative work via a profile on their Instagram. If you, or someone you know, is doing thoughtful and innovative work that should be shared, please contact me via email so I can send a proposal in as a candidate. Let's highlight the brilliant work done by EPs here in our state!
