The Council Best Practice Committee, along with the communications and elections subcommittees have been working in the background these past few months. The Best Practices group is streamlining our processes for developing and writing recommendations as well as refining elements of the Council Handbook.

Last week, Councilors heard speeches from the candidates for the At Large Representative to the Council. The results of those elections should be available before the end of July. The next round of Council elections will be held in early August, for the three positions of 2026 Moderator, 2026 Moderator-Elect/2027 Moderator, and the At Large Director on the AIA Board.

Council News

THE COUNCIL WANTS TO HEAR FROM YOU – SURVEY RESULTS

In the April Monthly Report, the Council asked for feedback on members' perceptions of the most pressing professional or industry 'pain points'. Below are the results of the top responses we received.

AIA STRATEGIC COUNCIL ENGAGEMENT THEMES - JULY 2025

Q: What would you identify as the most critical professional or industry-related challenges or areas of concern that you are currently encountering, either at the individual or firm level?

Unrealistic client expectations of delivery schedule, project cost, and outcomes.

Contractors and Developers hold the keys to starting projects instead of architects, we are becoming an afterthought.

Competitive Fees to continue to inspire the best talent.

Not enough experience with different sectors, meaning larger projects. Our focus is efficiency based and expertise in one sector of fit out spaces.

Slow to no proactive adoption of technological advancements or digital platforms.

There isn't enough experience with being on site, learning how things work, not engaging enough with the clients specifically.

STUDY GROUP UPDATES

AIA OF THE FUTURE

The AIA of the Future team is reviewing the organization as a whole and discussing what partnerships could be formed to strengthen our relationships beyond the profession. Our recommendations for the next steps on this topic will be presented during the September presentation. Members of the AIA of the Future and Architect of the Future study groups have been invited to join the July Young Architects Forum (YAF) AdCom call to talk about their findings and how they align with the goals of the YAF.

ARCHITECT OF THE FUTURE

As we look back on our collective efforts, we prepare to distill our findings to not only document our process but also shape the path forward. We've divided into focused subgroups—research and inspiration, the persona exercise, and data collection through member outreach—each contributing a vital piece to our narrative. As the architect of the future group, our ability to inspire change will depend on how clearly and effectively we present the depth and value of the work we've done. This moment is not just about reflection—it's about translating vision into momentum.

CLIMATE RESPONSIVE DESIGN & LEADERSHIP

The Climate Responsive Design & Leadership (CRD&L) team continues its monthly publication of Climate Corner, with two to three additional issues planned before the final 2025 presentation in September. In preparation for the August issue on Regenerative Design, CRD&L will interview 2025 AIA President-Elect Illya Azaroff, FAIA, on Wednesday, July 9th. This interview will provide an in-depth exploration of the topic, contributing to the ongoing dialogue on sustainable architectural practices.



ENHANCE YOUR SUSTAIN-ABILITIES this July with designing a for a circular economy – a building industry where construction waste is recycled, remanufactured or reused to make new buildings, thus reducing the total new raw material needed and reducing the amount of waste going to landfills. CONNECTED COMMUNITIES

To expand on AIA's current initiative to publicize and highlight the use of Key Architects in municipal governments, the Connected Communities study group's objective is to amplify the Key Architect's benefits to the community in leading efforts to address social, economic, and physical challenges. As the Key Architect champions equitable housing and community development, the sensitive harvesting and application of data (via AI technologies) will serve to unite public agencies, communities, and private partners.

DIGITAL ARCHITECTURE

The Digital Architecture Study Group has divided into four focused teams: Equity, Wellbeing, Business, and Future Positioning. Each subgroup is drafting 1 to 2 page summaries of research to date to help shape our unified report and August presentation. We are aligning with the AI Task Force and broader Council objectives while tracking Task Force developments to identify overlaps and refine our role as a strategic bridge between implementation and member needs.

RESILIENT PRACTICE MODELS

The Resilient Practice Models study group completed a comprehensive sprint evaluating 160+ executive orders for their impact on architecture, resulting in a detailed memo to the AIA Board with recommendations across seven categories. Subgroups are finalizing content for our August presentation, including internal, external, and professional pressures facing practice. We're exploring what's next, considering long-term issues like AI disruption, practice equity, business acumen, research in practice, and evolving service models.

10-YEAR VALUATION & FUTURE BLUEPRINT

The initial research and stakeholder interview phase has concluded with excellent participation. After analyzing a significant volume of data over the past month, the group has reached a strong consensus on the strategic direction of our findings. We are currently preparing a preliminary report for the Governance Task Force, while concurrently developing the final report and recommendations for the council's review. We feel really positive with the direction this is all heading for the Council!

GOVERNANCE TASK FORCE UPDATE

The Governance Task Force has released its recap memo from its June 30th meeting where the group's discussion focused on the findings from governance stakeholder interviews and the next steps anticipated by the task force. This has been distributed to various AIA Community Hubs, including CACE and AIA Leadership Network. The next major milestone is to engage in a work session to explore potential governance models (Board, Strategic Council, Knowledge Communities) for structural organization, roles and responsibilities, communication/transparency process, decision and policy reporting to Components and membership.

2025 FUTURE FORWARD GRANT RECIPIENT

The 2025 Future Forward Grant has been awarded to Neşe Altıntaş, Assoc. AIA, NOMA, CWA, for her research proposal titled “Beyond the Classroom.”

The Future Forward Grant, a project by the Large Firm Roundtable (LFRT) and the AIA Young Architects Forum (YAF), supports students, emerging professionals and early career architects in testing innovative ideas that challenge traditional architecture practices. The goal of the \$10,000 grant is to foster innovation by providing the necessary resources to pursue untested ideas and drive exploration and disruption in the profession.
