The Manawa Kūpono Native Hawaiian Scholarship Program provides tuition assistance to classified undergraduate and graduate students of Native Hawaiian ancestry who will be enrolled at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa during the Summer 2022 session(s). Awards may be granted for up to six (6) credits and can only be used to cover the cost of tuition. Any unpaid tuition and fees will be the student's responsibility. Scholarship recipients are expected to successfully complete all funded courses with a grade of "C" or better.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

1. Be of Hawaiian Ancestry
2. Be a classified full-time undergraduate or graduate student at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa.
3. Demonstrate financial need based on the Estimated Family Contribution (EFC) from the 2021-2022 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

4. Possess a cumulative GPA of 2.50 or better (for undergraduate students) or 3.00 (for graduate students) at the time of application.

PREFERENCE

Interested individuals who meet the criteria above are encouraged to apply. Note that applicants who also meet the additional criteria below will be given priority consideration.

1. Graduates from one of our target high schools:
 - James B. Castle High School, Kailua High School, Ke Kula Kaiapuni 'o Ānuenue, Nānākuli High School, Wai'anae High School, Hāna High School, Hilo High School, Lāna'i High School, Moloka'i High School, Waimea High School
2. Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM), Hawaiian Language or Early Childhood Education majors.


TO APPLY

Applications received after the deadline will be deemed late and not considered. Manawa Kūpono will not be responsible for any lost, or delayed application and/or required documents.

Proof of Hawaiian ancestry. Submit only one copy of any of the following:

- Birth Certificate, OHA Hawaiian Registry, Department of Hawaiian Home Land lease (DHHL), Kamehameha Schools Ho'oulu Hawaiian Data Center Verification Letter

Personal essay up to two pages answering the following prompt:

- *What do you feel is your kuleana as a Native Hawaiian? How has your education contributed to who you are today?*

Resume (should be up-to-date and critiqued)

A copy of your 2021-2022 FAFSA Student Aid Report (SAR)

Unofficial copy of your UHM college transcript.
