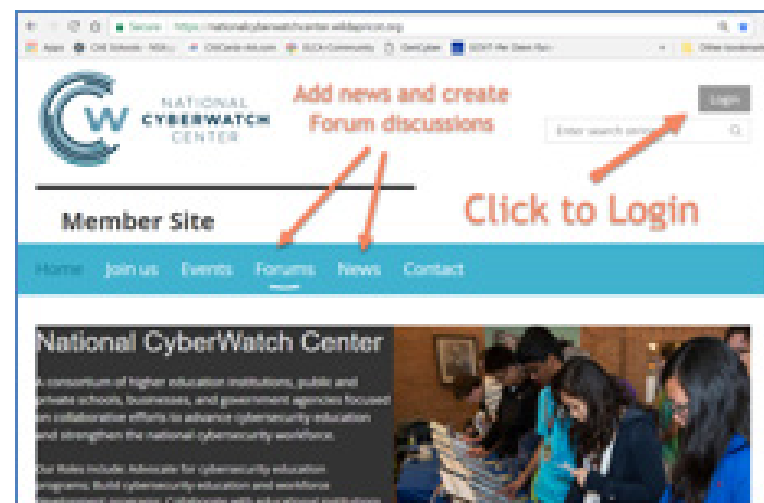


Center Update

New National CyberWatch Center Member Site Launched!

For the past week, CyberWatch members have been receiving email, notifying them of a new member benefit - - an online place to call our own! This new member website has been designed to support the cybersecurity community and facilitate communication, collaboration, idea propagation, and event awareness.

Member logon credentials are being rolled out across a three-week period, with the newest members receiving their login credentials first. Probably the biggest news is that now the designated "faculty contact" for each member school has the capability to add other faculty (full-time or adjunct) as members under their respective institutions.



This new app, powered by the Wild Apricot association management software, also gives members the ability to post **News** about their programs, or contribute opinions or topical information under the **Forums** menu. For posting information on specific campus **Events** such as an upcoming workshop, conference or webinar hosted by your school, the current process is to send your information to the National CyberWatch Center's Chair of Membership, Dr. Barbara Belón (bjbelon@gmail.com), who will not only post it on the Member site, but also forward to our marketing staff for inclusion in the next issue of the *National CyberWatch Communicator*.
