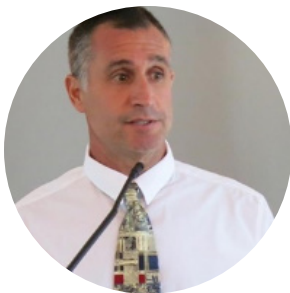
Brig Berthold – Panelist
