



## Congregation Or Tzion Covid Policy

Dear Congregant,

We are grateful to be able to welcome you back into the Synagogue. The health and safety of our congregants is our highest priority. We have gone to great lengths to ensure that our Shul is a clean and safe environment. By reading and following the policies below, you can help us to keep it that way. You will be asked to submit your signed form at the door when you arrive.

**If you have not read and signed this form, you will not be permitted to enter the Shul.**

All children under age 18 in attendance must be listed below, and accompanied by a responsible, supervising adult who has read, signed and submitted this form at the time of entry.

1. If you have been travelling in the past two weeks, stay home.
2. If you are sick (fever, chills, cough, shortness of breath, GI illness, and/or loss of taste/smell), stay home.
3. If you are considered high-risk (age over 65, chronic medical conditions), we STRONGLY ADVISE you to stay home.
4. Attendees will be screened at the door by a trained volunteer for fever, chills, cough, shortness of breath, GI illness, and loss of taste/smell. If any screening questions are answered yes, the attendee and those arriving with them will be asked to return home.
5. Attendees will undergo temperature screening with an infrared thermometer at the door. Those with a temperature >100.4 will be asked to return home.
6. Attendees are required to bring and wear a face covering at all times. If you do not have a mask, please go to [www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/diy-cloth-face-coverings.html](http://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/diy-cloth-face-coverings.html) for instructions on how to make a simple cloth facemask. If you or your children remove your mask after being reminded of the policy, you will be asked to leave.
7. Attendees will maintain a distance of 6 feet from other congregants at all times. Do not shake hands, hug, or make any physical contact with other attendees.
8. Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth during the service.
9. Hand sanitizer will be available for use when entering and exiting the sanctuary.
10. Please bring your own Kippot and Tallit. Kippot are available for use, but we ask that you please not return them. Once you take it, it is yours.
11. Even while wearing a mask, cover your cough or sneeze with your elbow. Bring and use Kleenex rather than a handkerchief if wiping your nose or eyes.
12. Do not kiss any ritual items, including the Torah, Mezuzot, Siddurim and Tallit.
13. Use only one Siddur and one Chumash per person.
