Maya Gonzalez is an artist, progressive educator and award-winning children's book illustrator and author. Her primary tool of activism is creating and publishing radical children's books that tell the truth of who we are and what we can be.

In this talk, Maya will share an orientation toward gender outside of the Western frame. This has far reaching implications in how we talk, what and how we teach, and how we can unite children (and people) across lines and strengthen their hearts and ability to learn. By learning to hold simple truths in our everyday work, we can change not only the moment, but help create a whole new multidisciplinary framework for the future that includes a place for everybody.
