A Proclamation of the Gospel according to Luke.

My siblings in Christ,

There was a rich man who dressed in purple and fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every day. At his gate, on his doorstep, lay a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores. He longed to satisfy his hunger with what fell from the rich man's table. Even the dogs would come to lick his sores.

The poor man died and was carried away by the angels to be with Sarah and Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried. From Hades, where he was being tormented, he looked up and saw Sarah and Abraham far away with Lazarus by their side. He called out, "Mother Sarah, Father Abraham, have mercy on me. Send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in the water and cool my tongue, for I am in agony in these flames."

But they said, "Child, remember that during your lifetime you received good things, and Lazarus, evil things. Now he is comforted here and you

are in agony. Apart from all this, between you and us a great chasm has been fixed, so that those who might want to pass from here to you cannot do so; and no one can cross from there to us."

Sarah and Abraham said to him, "If they do not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced even if someone rises from the dead."
