Second Reading: From a Letter of Paul to Philemon 1-2, 9-10, 12-19a - Lector Linda Joyce

A Reading from a Letter of Paul to Philemon

Paul, a prisoner of Jesus the Christ, and Timothy our brother; to Philemon our dear friend and coworker, to Apphia our sister, and to Archippus, a soldier among us, and to the church in your house:

I appeal to you on the basis of love—and I, Paul, do this as an old man, and also as a prisoner for the sake of Jesus the Christ. I appeal now to you for my child, Onesimus, whose father I have become during my imprisonment. I am sending him, that is, my own heart, back to you. I would like to keep him with me, to serve to me in your place during my imprisonment for the gospel. I write this appeal to you because I prefer to do nothing without your consent, so that your good deed might be voluntary and not something forced.

Perhaps the reason Onesimus was separated from you for a while is so that you might have him back forever, no longer as a slave but as more than a slave, as beloved kin. He has been family, especially to me, but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in Jesus the Christ. So, if you consider me your partner, welcome him as you would welcome me. If he has wronged you in any way, or owes you anything, charge that to my account. I, Paul, am writing this with my own hand: I will repay it.
