I am not like the fowls of the heaven, because even the fowls of the heaven are productive before Thee, O God. Alas! to what have I been likened? I am not like these waters, because even these waters are productive before Thee, O God. Alas! to what have I been likened? I am not like this earth, because even the earth bringeth forth its fruits in season, and blesseth Thee, O God.

And, behold, an angel of the Lord stood by, saying: Anna, Anna, God hath heard thy prayer, and thou shalt conceive and shall bring forth; and

And her months were fulfilled. In the ninth month Anna brought forth. And she said to the midwife: What have I brought forth? The midwife replied: A girl. And Anna said: My soul has been magnified this day. The days having been fulfilled, Anna was purified, and gave the breast to the child, and called her name Mary.
