March 13: Family Housing Network (FFH) supports families experiencing homelessness to achieve sustainable self-sufficiency. MoM will collect cleaning products especially laundry pods, dryer sheets, bleach, after shower spray, multi-purpose spray (Spic and Span is great), liquid dish soap, dish

#### **Dominican Sisters Relief Fund - Ukraine:**

Poland has already received over 500,000 Ukrainian refugees and many more are expected. In response to a plea from a sister Ecumenical Catholic Communion community in Poland, the Mary of Magdala Leadership Council has agreed to match up to \$2000 in donations for the Polish Dominican Sisters who are "working the front lines" welcoming and serving Ukrainian refugees who are fleeing to Poland.
