Gospel Reading: Luke 2: 21-40 Father Teri Harroun

May the love of God be with you all A proclamation of the Gospel according to Luke.

Eight days after Mary had given birth, it was time to circumcise their child. He was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb.

When the time came for purification according to the Law of Moses, Joseph and Mary brought Jesus to Jerusalem to present him to God. (It is written in the Law of God: "Every firstborn male shall be set apart and offered as holy to God.") So, they offered the appropriate sacrifice for Jesus according to what is stated in the Law: "a pair of turtle-doves or two young pigeons."

Now, there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon. He was upright and devout, looking

forward to the consolation of Israel. The Holy Spirit dwelt in him. It had been revealed to Simeon by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen God's Anointed. Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the Temple. When Mary and Joseph brought Jesus into the Temple, to do for him what was customary under the law, Simeon took Jesus in his arms and praised God, singing,

"Now let Your servant depart in peace, for Your word has been fulfilled. My eyes have seen Your bearer of justice, made ready in the sight of all peoples: a revelation to the Gentiles, and glory to Your people."



The child's parents were amazed at what was being said about him. Then Simeon blessed them, and said to Mary, "This child is destined for the fall and the rise of many, destined to be a sign that will be opposed. The inner thoughts of many will be laid bare. And a sword will pierce your own heart too."

There was also a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was very old. After seven years of marriage, she lived as a widow to the age of eighty-four. She never left the Temple but worshipped there with fasting and prayer, night and day. At the moment Simeon

finished speaking, she joined those gathered and began to praise God. She spoke about the child to all who were anticipating liberation.

When Mary and Joseph had completed everything required by the Law of God, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom. The favor of God was upon him.

God, Emmanuel, You are most Holy. Send your Holy Spirit upon us, and what we do here gathered at tables throughout your world knowing that all tables are Your Table. May we be touched by your Spirit, to be signs of love and peace to one another, and to the world. * Let also your Spirit come upon these gifts of bread and wine to make them holy so that they may become for us the Body and Blood of our brother, Jesus the Christ.

Today, we gather to remember that on the night before he died, Jesus ate with his followers and his friends. We recall how he took a loaf of bread, and after blessing it, he broke it, and gave it to them saying

ALL: Take this all of you, and eat it: this is my Body, which will be given up for you.

That same night, Jesus also took the cup filled with wine, and after giving thanks, passed it to his disciples, saying:

ALL: Take this, all of you, and drink from it. This is the cup of my Blood, the Blood of the new and everlasting covenant. It will be shed for you and for all so that sins may be forgiven. Do this in memory of me.

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith:
