Liturgy of the Word

First Reading: Acts 1:3-5, 12-14, 15 - *Lector Lynne Barnes*

Jesus presented himself alive to the disciples by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them over forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While meeting with them, he urged them not to leave Jerusalem but to wait for "the promise of God about which you have heard me speak. John baptized with water, but in a few days, you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

The disciples returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olive, which is near Jerusalem, a Sabbath's day journey away. When they entered the city, they went to the upper room where they were staying. Peter and John, James and

Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot, and Jude son of James were there.

With one heart, all of them joined constantly in prayer, with some of the women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, and Jesus' siblings. Altogether, there was a group of about one hundred and twenty persons gathered in the one place.

Thomas, called the “Twin”, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when the risen Jesus first came to them in the locked upper room. When the other disciples saw him, they said, “We have seen the Christ.” But Thomas replied, “Unless I can see the holes the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, unless I can put my hand into his side, I will not believe.”

A week later, the disciples were again inside where they had been that first day, but this time Thomas was with them. Although the doors again were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, “Peace be with you.” Then he said to Thomas, “Put your finger here. See my hands. Give me your hand. Put it into my side. Do not be

unbelieving, but believe.” Thomas answered, “The Messiah! My God!” Jesus said to him, “Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.”
