Greeting Rev. Jane Reina

Welcome to the 3rd Sunday in OT. It may not feel like we are living in ordinary times. It may feel more like living in a time of dark chaos. The early Christians may have felt the same after the Resurrection of Jesus. The people of the early Eastern Rite prayed the classic penitential prayer: Jesus, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner.

If you, like me, were raised Roman Catholic, we believed that the penitential rite was about penance, confession, forgiveness. We prayed it that way. Today, I ask that we consider penitential from the Hebrew, teshuva, and Greek, metanoia. In both translations we can find that penitential can mean 'to return' or a 'change of mind.' It is less focused on a change of behavior and more on a change of perception of the world, a change of thinking not. Jesus taught a change in the understanding of each other as human beings, a new way of compassionate acceptance. How we do that is individual and can change over time.

Please try to remember this 'turning back' when we pray the penitential rite today.

So, let us continue as one expression of God's people gathered here + In the name of the Creating Mystery, Jesus our Christ, and the Holy Spirit, Sophia. **All: Amen**
