2nd Reading; 1Corinthians 12. 1-11- Lector David Cloyd

Sisters and brothers, I want to instruct you on the matter of spiritual gifts. Remember how, when you were still nonbelievers, you were drawn to mute idols and led astray by them?

It is for this reason that I want you to understand that no one can be speaking under the influence of the Holy Spirit and say, "Curse Jesus"; by the same token, no one can say "Jesus Christ reigns supreme", unless under the influence of the Holy Spirit.

There is a variety of gifts, but always the same Spirit. There is a variety of ministries, but we serve the same One. There is a variety of outcomes, but the same God is working in all of

them. To each person is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good.

To one, The Spirit gives wisdom in discourse, to another, the word of knowledge through the same Spirit. Through the Spirit, one person receives faith; through the same Spirit another is given the gift of healing; and still another, miraculous powers. Prophecy is given to one; to another, power to distinguish one spirit from another. One receives the gift of tongues; another, that of interpreting tongues. But it is one and the same Spirit who produces all these gifts and distributes them as she wills.

A reading from the holy gospel according to John

When Jesus learned that the Pharisees had heard he was attracting and baptizing more disciples than John—though it was really not Jesus baptizing, but his disciples—he left Judea and returned to Galilee. He stopped in Samaria beside Jacob's well.

Jesus weary from the journey, came and sat by the well. It was around noon. When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink." The disciples had gone off to the town to buy provisions. The Samaritan woman replied, "You're a Jew. How can you ask me, a Samaritan for a drink?"—since Jews had nothing to do with Samaritans.

Jesus answered, "If only you recognized God's gift, and who it is that is asking you for a drink, you would have asked him for a drink instead, and he would have given you living water."

"If you please," she challenged Jesus, "you don't have a bucket and this well is deep. Where do you expect to get this 'living water'? surely you don't pretend to be greater than our ancestors Leah and Rachel and Jacob, who gave us this well and drank from it with their descendants and flocks?"

Jesus replied, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again. But those who drink the water I give them will never be thirsty; no, the water I give will become fountains within them, springing up to provide eternal life."

The woman said to Jesus, "Give me this water so that I won't be thirsty and have to keep coming all the way here to draw water."

Jesus told her, "Believe me, the hour is coming when you'll worship God neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. You people worship what you don't understand; we worship what we do understand—after all, salvation is from the Jewish people. Yet the hour is coming—and is already here—when real worshipers will worship God in Spirit and truth. Indeed, it is just such worshipers whom God seeks. God is Spirit, and those who worship God must worship in spirit and truth."

The woman said to Jesus, "I know that the Messiah—the Anointed One—is coming and will tell us everything. Jesus replied, "I who speak to you am the Messiah."
