

Liturgy of the Word

Let us listen to the Word of God in our midst.

First Reading: A Reading from the Book of Deuteronomy 26:1-2 (abridged), 4-8, 9c,

10acd-11; 30:10-14 Lector Lynne Barnes

When you come into the land, take some first fruits of your harvest and place them in a basket. Then go to God's dwelling place. The priest will take the basket and place it in front of God's altar.

Then, declare in the presence of your God, "My ancestors were Aramean refugees who went down to Egypt with a small household and lived there as resident aliens. There, they became a great nation, strong and numerous. When the Egyptian ruling class maltreated, oppressed, and enslaved us, imposing harsh servitude upon us, we cried to God, the God of our ancestors. God heard our cry and saw our affliction, our toil and our oppression. God then brought us out of Egypt with a strong hand and outstretched arm, with terrifying power, with signs and wonders. God brought us to a land flowing with milk and honey. Now, therefore, I have brought the first fruits of the products of the soil."

You shall set your offering before God and bow down before God. Then, you and your

household, together with the Levite and the resident aliens who live among you, shall

celebrate with all these good things which God has given you.

Listen to the voice of God. Keep the commandments that I give you today, the

full presence of an open heart stitches another rip in the Living Universe. Wisdom is


woven from our shared humanity, one giving thread at a time.


A Proclamation of the Holy Gospel attributed to Luke. (10: 25-37.)





Eucharistic Prayer


The Risen Christ is with you. All: And also with you.

It will be shed for you and for all


so that sins may be forgiven. Do this in memory of me.



Invitation to Communion


As we partake of the sustenance laid before us, let us affirm together:
