LITURGY OF THE WORD

Let us listen to the Good News and the message of the healing power of Jesus, our Christ.

First Reading: Acts 14:21-27 Lector Cathy Engel

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

After Paul and Barnabas had proclaimed the good news to the city of Derbe and made a considerable number of disciples, they returned to Lystra, Iconium, and Antioch. In each place, they strengthened the spirits of the disciples and exhorted them to persevere in the faith, saying, "It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the reign of God."

They appointed presbyters (vocations) for them in each church and, with prayer and fasting, commended them to God in whom they had put their faith.

Then, they traveled through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. After proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia. From there they sailed back to Antioch where they had been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now accomplished.

When they arrived, they called the church together and related all that God had done with them, and how God had opened a door of faith for the Gentiles. Paul and Barnabas stayed there with the disciples for some time.

A Proclamation of the Gospel of John

The risen Christ appeared to the disciples, this time at the Sea of Tiberias (also known as the Sea of Galilee). This is what happened: Simon Peter, Thomas (nicknamed "Twin"), Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the brothers Zebedee, and two other disciples were together. Simon Peter announced, "I'm going fishing." The rest of them replied, "We're going with you." They went out and got in the boat. They caught nothing that night.

When the sun came up, Jesus was standing on the beach, but they didn't recognize him. Jesus spoke to them: "Good morning! Did you catch anything for breakfast?" They answered, "No." He said, "Throw the net off the right side of the boat and see what happens." They did what he said. All of a sudden there were so many fish in it, the disciples weren't strong enough to pull it in.

Then the disciple Jesus loved said to Peter, "It's Jesus!"

When Simon Peter realized that it was the Teacher, he threw on some clothes, for he was stripped for work, and then dived into the sea.

The other disciples came in by boat for they weren't far from land, a hundred yards or so, pulling along the net full of fish. When they got out of the boat, they saw a fire laid, with fish and bread already cooking on it.

Jesus said, "Bring some of the fish you've just caught." Simon Peter joined them and pulled the net to shore—153 big fish! And even with all those fish, the net didn't rip.

Jesus said, "Come and eat. Breakfast is ready." Not one of the disciples dared ask, "Who are you?" They knew who it was. Jesus then took the bread and gave it to them. He did the same with the fish.

This was now the third-time Jesus had shown himself alive to the disciples since being raised from the dead.

Eucharistic Prayer
