First Reading: Lector Ruth Alexander Wisdom 7. 22-25, 27-30

Our first reading is from Wisdom, Chapter 7

Wisdom was my teacher, and it was She who designed all these things. Inside Wisdom, there is a spirit of intelligence and holiness that is unique and unmistakable: subtle, dynamic, perceptive, pristine, unclouded, unconquerable, compassionate, shrewd, compelling, generous, and loving toward mortals, faithful, faultless, serene, directing all, knowing all, and pervading every intelligent, pure, and most subtle spirit.

For Wisdom moves more swiftly than motion itself; She is so pure that She pervades and permeates all living things. She is a breath of the power of God, a pure light of the glory of the Most High, and nothing that is base can come into Her presence in secret.

Though alone of Her kin, she can do all things; though unchanging, she renews all things; generation after generation She enters into holy souls and makes them friends of God and prophets, for God loves the one who finds a home in Wisdom. She is more beautiful than the sun and more magnificent than all the stars in the sky.

One Who Loves Enemies, by Joyce Rupp, from Jesus, Friend of My Soul

Familiar persons or strangers may criticize unfairly, deliberately try to antagonize, shut me out of their life, or even wish me dead due to my beliefs, social position, nationality, or religion. When they do this, they act as an enemy. I have a

choice when this happens. Even if someone considers me their foe, I do not have to return a similar response. People will only become my enemy if I deliberately wish to injure or hassle



them. This benefits no one and tosses away the possibility of moving beyond antipathies.

How do we pray for those who oppose us? How can our battered hearts muster up a peacegenerating posture? When Jesus taught, "Love our enemies," he could have said—as author James Martin, S.J., does—"See that person as God sees him or her." This frees us to stand apart from our emotional and mental entanglements. We can give people who oppose us over to the Holy One without demanding they accept our viewpoints.

This is what Jesus would expect of us. We may not experience a feeling of affection for people who combat us, but we can intentionally place them in care of the Divine with no strings attached. We do so not with smugness or superiority. Rather, we freely let go of treating them like they are an enemy.

Gospel Reading: Luke 7:36-50 Rev. Jane Reina

Our God be with you. A proclamation of the Good News according to Luke.

A Pharisee invited Jesus to a meal. Jesus entered the Pharisee's house and reclined at table. Later, a woman from the city, a woman known as a sinner, having learned that Jesus was a guest in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster jar filled with oil of myrrh. She stood behind Jesus and knelt at his feet, weeping. She wet his feet with her tears and wiped them with her hair, kissing his feet and anointing them with the myrrh. When the Pharisee who had invited Jesus saw this, he said to himself, "If this man were a prophet, he would have known who and what kind of woman this is who is touching him - that she is a sinner."

Jesus spoke up. "Simon, I have something to say to you." "What is it, Teacher?" he replied. "There was a certain creditor who had two debtors. One debtor owed five hundred denarii. The other owed fifty. When neither could not pay, the

You gave me no water for my feet, but she has bathed my feet with her tears and dried them with her hair. You gave me no kiss, but from the time she came in, she has not stopped kissing my feet. You did not anoint my head with oil, but she has anointed my feet with myrrh.

"Therefore, I tell you, her wrongdoings, which were many, have been forgiven, for she has shown great love. But the one to whom little is forgiven, loves little."

themselves, "Who is this, that he can forgive sins?"
