1st reading: The Narrow Gate - Lector Art Bavoso

“The Narrow Gate” by Joan Chittister, from IN GOD’S HOLY LIGHT.

Amma Theodora said, “Let us strive to enter by the narrow gate. Just as the trees, if they haven’t stood before the winter’s storms cannot bear fruit, so it is with us, this present age is a storm and it is only through many trials and temptation that we can obtain an inheritance in the kin-dom of heaven.”

Amma Theodora is a woman of our own times. She knows that no religious regimen alone can possibly make us truly spiritual people. She knows that it is not what we do to satisfy our religious obligations that makes us holy. It is, instead, what we do when it seems impossible to do anything to make the world the place God means it to be. It is making the world in any way religious at all that tests the mettle in us. Then we can see the effect of the religious practices we do. Then we come to know what it means to “enter through the narrow gate.” . . .



It is character, she tells us, it is the quality of goodness in a person, that is truly spiritual and that is demanded in difficult times. . . .To be truly spiritual people in our own time, rote religion will not do. Only by applying the Word of God to the issues of the day can we ever hope to claim to be disciples now.

2nd Reading: Ephesians 1. 1b, 15-23 –Lector Matt Chavez

A Reading from Paul's Letter to the Ephesians. To God's holy ones in Ephesus, the faithful in Christ Jesus...

Ever since I heard about your faith in Jesus the Christ, and your love for all God's people—all the holy ones, I have not stopped giving thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers.

May the Glorious One, the God of Jesus the Christ, give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation, resulting in knowledge of God. May the eyes of your heart be enlightened, that you may know the hope that belongs to your call, the riches of glory in sharing the inheritance of God's holy ones, and the incomparable power that is exercised for those who believe. This is the same power that was at work in



Jesus the Christ when he was raised from the dead and sent into the heavens, filling them with the Christ.

This Cosmic Christ is a universal presence, exceeding every rule and authority, power and dominion, and any name that is invoked, not only in this present age but also in the age to come. God placed all things in care of the Christ, who was made the head of the church. The church is Christ's body, the fullness of the One who fills everything in every way.

After being rejected in his hometown, Nazareth,

Jesus went around to the villages in the vicinity to teach there.

He summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two,
giving them authority over unclean spirits.

Jesus instructed them to take nothing for their journey
except a staff, a walking stick:

no food, no sack, no money in their belts.

They were, however, to wear sandals,
but not an extra tunic over their clothes.

Jesus said, "Whenever you enter a house anywhere,
stay there until you leave that district.

If you are not welcome in a place, or people do not listen to you,
leave there, and shake the dust from your feet in testimony against them

So, they set off, preaching repentance.

They drove out many demons,
and they anointed with oil many who were sick, and healed them.

Upon returning, they rejoined Jesus and reported all they had done and taught.

Jesus said to them, "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place
and rest a while."

People were coming and going in great numbers,
and they did not even have time to eat.



So, they left in a boat by themselves to a deserted place.
But people saw them leaving and many more came to know about it.
They hastened on foot from all the towns,
arriving at the place ahead of Jesus and the disciples.
When Jesus disembarked and saw the vast crowd,
his heart was moved with compassion for them,
for they were like sheep without a shepherd.
He began to teach them many things.
The Good News of Salvation of Jesus our Christ.

Preface of God's Triune Mystery

(Michael J. Nicosia © 2022, based on Anselm of Canterbury's PROSLOGION)

God is with you. **All: And also with you.**

Lift up your hearts. **All: We lift them up to God.**

Let us give thanks to our loving God. **All: It is right to give God thanks and praise.**

You are worthy of our praise, O God Most High,
for our souls have found your being to be life itself;



light, wisdom, and goodness, everywhere and always;
eternal blessedness and blessed eternity.

Found, I say, (if pure mystery can be found,) only by your grace;
for we touch upon truth only by being touched by it.

The mystery of your Triune-Being opens us
to the varied possibilities of encounter with You
—as Source and Ground of our being,
—as Uttered Word accomplishing your Will and enfleshing your Love,
—as Breathe that moves and convicts and directs and empowers,
that we may be united to You and to one another.

We are relational beings, created in your image and likeness;
relational, You invite us in.
Yet mystery You remain,
for the eye of the soul is both darkened by its own limitations
and dazzled by your glory.

Most High, who are the Three and the One God,
blessed for ever and ever,
we pray to know You all the more, to love You all the more,
advancing day by day, until our joy comes to the full
and our hope is fully realized in the promise of heaven.

Still, what the mind cannot grasp, the heart can sing;
and so we join the angels and saints in glory in their eternal hymn of praise:

Remember, O God, all those who have died....

Welcome them into your glorious presence

and all who have gone before us touched by your Spirit
as they enjoy the fullness of the communion that is our destiny.
