



2021 ELECTIONS/VOTING

What You Need to Know:

- **Any registered Fairfax County voter** may vote early at any Fairfax County early voting location.
- Early in-person absentee voting is available for the **November 2021 General & Special Elections** at the following three locations from September 17th through October 30th:

 - Fairfax County, Mount Vernon and North County 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 pm
- **Sunday** (October 24th)
 - Fairfax County, Mount Vernon, North County 1:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m.

- Absentee voters who choose to vote in person at a satellite office should bring and surrender the ballot they received by mail.

Reporting on the Mount Vernon Government Center

The Center is staffed by The Chief, Mr. James Hix, the Assistant Chief, Ms. Mary Jane Von Wryeza , and the staff members, whose job is to greet the voters coming in to vote.

By using poll pads, the staff registers them. A Ballot is given to the Voters to fill out. Other staff members are by the DS200 Voting Machine where the ballots are dropped in.

From the time the polls were opened on September 17 to date, there are two choices to cast a Ballot:

Voters use the Express Vote Machine to fill out their voting choices and print a Ballot Voting Card.

Voters may choose a preprinted paper Ballot and fill out the circles accordingly.

Once the Ballot Voting Card or Paper Ballot is ready for voting, the voter deposits it in the DS200 voting machine, which automatically pulls in the Ballot Voting Card or Paper Ballot and process it by dropping it into a seal container which counts the voters choices.

Voters who have asked for a Ballot to arrive at their home, have it processed by filling it out, placing it in an envelope and dropping it in the designated secured closed voting box during voting hours of operation only.

There are approximately 200 voters each day.
