

#### Shop Online—Stop the Spread—Save a Life

December is one of the busiest shopping seasons of the year. With holiday sales such a Black Friday and Cyber Monday, many start the hunt for holiday gifts from Thanksgiving onward. As with everything, shopping may look different in 2020. Take proper safety actions to minimize COVID-19 exposure this shopping season.

- 1. Shop online when you can and opt for home delivery or curbside pick-up
- 2. If you cannot shop online, shop during nonpeak hours
- 3. Wear a mask, keep your distance, and wash hands while out
- 4. Do NOT shop outside of home if you have been exposed or feel sick





With the influx of online shopping during the pandemic, it is more important than ever to ensure you are shopping safely online. Holiday scammers and hackers are looking for easy ways to take advantage of shoppers. When shopping online, follow these tips:

- Ship items to a secure location to minimize theft
- Only use official and verified retailer apps to shop
- Don't save credit card information on accounts
- Verify all unfamiliar retailers
- Never make purchases on public Wi-Fi
- Use strong passwords and a password manager
- Never give out your social security number to retailers
- Double-check emails some can be from outside sources
- Keep an eye on your accounts and statements after purchases

## **Holiday Season COVID-19 Safety**

Just like with Thanksgiving, we are encouraging everyone to make safe holiday plans. Protect your family and friends by considering virtual holiday celebrations. Data has shown that small family gatherings inside of the home to be a leading activity for COVID-19 infection. Know your risk and the risk of the activity before planning it. Our wonderful community has already donated over 20,000 masks to help keep people safe during the pandemic. The health department is still seeking child and adult sized mask donations.



#### **Happy Meteorological Winter!**

December 1st marks the start of meteorological winter, which lasts until the end of February. During this three-month period, our area can see freezing temperatures and winter storms. Are you winter ready yet? These four action items can help get you started:

- 1. Sign up for Fairfax Alerts to receive weather information and road closures.
- 2. Have supplies in your car in case you are stranded in a winter storm
  - -Snow shovel, brush, and scraper
  - -Jumper Cables
  - -Flares or Roadside Triangles
  - -Blankets
  - -Food, water, and other essentials needed if stranded for hours
- 3. Check home heating systems to ensure all are running properly.
- 4. Create a plan and list any needs that you may have if you were to lose power to your home for multiple days.
