Japanese water-based marbling on paper (also known as *suminagashi*, Japanese for "floating ink"), dates back to the Heian period of Japan (794-1185). Inks are gently floated on the surface of the water and a sheet of paper laid on top to capture the resultant radiating swirls of color. Participants will create sheets to take home and bind your favorite sheets for a unique blank journal. Enjoy a non-stressful creative outlet with guaranteed fun and success!

Catherine specializes in Japanese and Western hand papermaking, encaustic painting and mixed media drawing. She has taught throughout the globe and was a national faculty for R&F Paints for 6 years. She is faculty member of the Sonoran Desert Museum Arts Institute since 2003.
