Come join us and bring the family. Be prepared for some outdoor activities, a picnic, and good company. Maybe even enjoy a little camping.

The Summer Quarterly will be held at Pawtuckaway State Park in Nottingham, NH. The day will include some excellent educational sessions in the morning – presented in two tracts; a "seasoned surveyor" and a "young surveyor" tract. After class there will be a super special, Executive-Board-Grilled picnic! A classic charcoal cooked picnic for members and their families is just what the doctor ordered. We'd love to include all members by inviting you to bring along your favorite dish, side or dessert, to share and show off your culinary skills. This is a BYOB park.

Mike Hammer will start off the young surveyors track with "COGO for Technicians Level 1". This presentation sets the foundation of Coordinate Geometry Survey Calculations by applying Azimuths, Bearings, and Trigonometric Formulas to compute local coordinates from plans. Participants will reduce a record plan, compute corner coordinates, and compute a coordinate inverse as a check. An understanding of the relationship and operation of Azimuths and Bearings is recommended in advance of the course. A Bearing and Azimuth primer / refresher is available over Microsoft Teams at 7:00pm on June 8th. Required materials: pencil, paper pad (preferably graph), and a scientific calculator with SIN, COS, TAN, DD, and DMS function. It would a good idea to use one that is compatible with the SIT/FLS exam requirements. Participants are expected to know how to enter DMS into their calculator.

Alongside Mike's class, **Luke Powell** will present to the seasoned surveyors, "**How Site-Specific Soil Surveys are Done**." Luke is a Wetland Scientist, Soil Scientist, and Forester. He will also be conducting a couple of hand dug soil samples on site using a tool known as a hand auger.

Jay Aube will follow Mike with the young surveyors discussing Surveying within 250' of Protected Waterbodies. Jay will discuss a lot of the fundamentals of the permitting process and the site elements that must be depicted on plans, including inventorying trees.

Following Luke, Charles Adams and Rick Brown from Ambit Engineering will present the seasoned surveyors with a Bathymetric Demo." Utilizing a Hydrone. The Hydrone is a portable, professional grade, watertight marine component that can be remotely controlled or autonomously navigated. It is designed to extend the capabilities of traditional survey equipment and efficiently conduct missions on the water. Allowing the surveyor to take measurements with a SonarMite from a total station to map the seafloor from the safety of the shoreline.

We will demonstrate the assembly, workflow of data collection, and capabilities of the Hydrone and discuss how we have been able to add this great piece of equipment to our ever-expanding toolbox.
