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NOTICE OF PUBLIC INFORMATION MEETING

Barstow Street and Riverfront Street Utility and Street Improvements

All interested persons are hereby notified that the City of Waukesha will hold an open-house style information meeting to discuss the reconstruction of N/NW Barstow Street and Riverfront Street.

The meeting will be held on **Tuesday, December 10th** at the **City of Waukesha City Hall Randall Room (Room 207), 201 Delafield Street, Waukesha, WI, from 4:30 to 6:30 p.m.** **You must enter through the upper level doors off Buena Vista Avenue.** Parking is available in the upper parking lot of City Hall, or across Delafield St. in the temporary lower parking lot. You may attend anytime during these hours.

As funded in the 2020 CIP budget, it is planned to reconstruct N/NW Barstow Street from Wisconsin Ave. to E. North St. and Riverfront Street from Madison St. to N. Barstow St. in 2020. The meeting is to present the improvements, traffic control and schedule, and to receive input on the project. Persons with a concern for or knowledge of drainage problems, basements that extend under the sidewalk or environmental issues such as underground storage tanks are encouraged to attend this meeting and provide information to the Engineers. Exhibits will be on display showing the proposed layout.

The project will include installation of new water main, lining of the sanitary sewer main and laterals, storm sewer rehabilitation, roadway reconstruction, traffic signal replacement & rehabilitation, bridge rehabilitation, pedestrian ramp reconstruction, sidewalk replacement and installation of a wider stone paver terrace. Some existing trees within the terrace will be removed as a part of the project and new street trees will be planted.

Construction is scheduled to begin in February 2020. Construction for this project will be phased as feasibly possible, however, sections of Barstow St. and Riverfront St. will be closed to through traffic at times throughout the project. Adjacent property owners will not be assessed for the improvement costs.

Representatives from the City of Waukesha Public Works Department, City of Waukesha Community Development Department, and the Waukesha Water Utility will be available to address concerns and answer questions. Public input is encouraged.
