- Kansas became a state January 29, 1861 and was the 34th state to join the Union.
- The struggle between pro- and anti-slave forces in Kansas was a major factor in the eruption of the Civil War. The violence led to the nickname "Bleeding Kansas."







- The Kansas motto is Ad astra per aspera, which means
 "to the stars through difficulties."
- The state was named for the Kansa Indians. In the English language they were known as the "People of the South Wind."
- The **state bird** is the Western Meadowlark, and the **state** animal is the American Buffalo.
- The state flower is the wild native sunflower.
- The state reptile is the ornate box turtle, and the state amphibian is the barred tiger salamander.
- The state song is "Home on the Range."
- Notable Kansans include John Brown, Walter Chrysler,
 John Steuart Curry, Bob Dole, Amelia Earhart, Dwight
 Eisenhower, Nancy Landon Kassebaum, Alfred Landon,
 Karl Menninger, James Naismith, Gordon Parks, George
