



Middle School & Upper School Student Dress Code

(updated July 2021)

Our dress code is intended to set a tone that reflects school as a place where important work is accomplished. Students are asked to balance personal expression and comfort with respect for creating an appropriate atmosphere in order to focus on academic success. Our dress code will be consistently enforced, and violations may result in consequences that may include not are but limited to: verbal warning, official note, parent communication, and being asked to go home to change.

Meets Dress Code:

- Clothing must be neat, clean and without holes or ripped.
- Clothing should not be excessively tight or loose.
- Hats, bandanas, hoods, or other headwear may not be worn indoors.
- Clothing may not reveal the midriff.
- Undergarments may not show at any time.
- Jeans or denim of any kind are not permissible.
- Sweatshirts of any kind are not permissible.
- Clothing should not be disruptive to learning.

Tops

Students are expected to wear collared shirts or dress shirts with sleeves. Female students may wear dress shirts without collars; however, not casual or printed t-shirts. Tops should cover the majority of the shoulder, or should be worn with a sweater or jacket. Sweaters, quarter zips, and jackets may be worn over a collared shirt.

Long- or short-sleeved collared, button-down shirts should be tucked-in and buttoned. Long- or short-sleeved blouses and turtlenecks are acceptable. Blazers or sweaters may be worn over tops.

Dresses

Dresses, skirts, or shorts must be no shorter than the middle of the thigh. The length must be longer than the fingertips when arms are straight down by one's side.

Bottoms

Students are expected to wear chino pants, dress pants, bermuda shorts, or shorts that are no shorter than the fingertips when arms are straight down by one's side. Athletic wear is not acceptable. Leggings, tights or athleisure wear items by themselves are not permitted.

Leggings or tights are permissible only when worn under skirts or dresses that are no shorter than the fingertips when arms are straight down by one's side.

Footwear

Upper school students are expected to wear dress shoes, loafers, clogs, boots, flats, or boat shoes. Middle school students are permitted to wear athletic shoes (sneakers) throughout the day due to their physical education classes. Students should bring athletic shoes if they are participating in extracurricular sporting events and store them in their locker or backpack. To ensure safety during all school activities closed-toe shoes are strongly recommended.

Head Coverings

Baseball hats or casual caps are not permitted to be worn indoors during the academic day or in academic settings. However, head coverings honoring religious or cultural traditions are always acceptable.

Special Occasion Dress Days

On days when there is a special event at the school students are required to dress more formally. Students can wear a dress blouse and dress pants, a skirt, a dress, dress slacks, dress shirt, and a tie. Jackets are encouraged though not required. All students are expected to wear appropriate dress shoes.

Special Circumstances

Occasionally, the academic dress code may be altered community-wide in consideration of the weather. From time to time, teachers or coaches may instruct specific dress expectations for a special event or activity, such as a field trip, celebration day, spirit week event, etc.). However, students are expected to be in dress code for field trips unless otherwise directed.
