





Mayor Randy Riddle of Grove City Borough Becomes PSAB President

Mayor Randy Riddle of Grove City Borough in Mercer County officially became the Pennsylvania State Association of Boroughs (PSAB) President at the association's 113th Annual Conference in Hershey, PA on June 4th, 2025.

First elected to Grove City Borough Council in 1996, Riddle was elected vice president, president and appointed Mayor in 2004, a position he has held ever since. He has been active in PSAB since 2000 and has an effective role in the Association of Mayors of the Boroughs of PA since 2004. In 2020, he was voted Mayor of the Year. Riddle has received many PSAB awards over the years, such as the Cecil K. Leberknight Award, the Thomas F. Chrostwaite Award, and the Carol Sambol Award. He also is quite involved in a successful Junior Council Program at Grove City Borough, which was established in 2011. He is also a Certified Borough Official (CBO).



Riddle served two terms as president for the Wolf Creek/Slippery Rock Creek Council of Governments (COG). He has also served as president of the Mercer County Boroughs Association (CBA). In addition, he currently serves on the Grove City Borough Council on several committees and has served on the board of directors for both the community library and the downtown revitalization projects.

Riddle graduated from the Grove City Area High School in 1975 and then graduated from Penn State's Shenango Valley Branch Campus in 1977 with an Associate Degree in Mechanical Engineering Technology. In 1981, he graduated from Youngstown State University with a

Bachelor of Science degree in Mechanical Engineering Technology. He earned high honors in each of his educational venues.

Riddle's career pathway started as a mechanical draftsman for five years at Commercial Shearing/Parker Hannifin in Youngstown, OH. The company manufactured hydraulic valves, pumps and motors. He then continued to work for the next 33 years at SATEC /Instron in Grove City as a mechanical draftsman, project engineer, engineering manager and inside sales.

As the PSAB President for 2025-2026, Riddle hopes to work with PSAB to increase conference attendance by having informative sessions and valuable training for all members. Increasing the Junior Council Program is also on his radar, as well as promoting networking with elected officials and administrators from across the Commonwealth at the conferences. In his words: "PSAB is an excellent resource to assist our 955 boroughs on local government issues. I plan to promote this valuable resource."

Riddle is married to his wife Sallie, a retired middle school teacher, for over 37 years. They have one daughter, two sons, eight granddaughters and two grandsons.
