



Dear West Valley-Mission Community,

Today, we are unfortunately faced with the harsh reality of the recent campus shooting at Michigan State University that resulted in multiple deaths and injuries. Our heartfelt condolences go out to the families and friends of those killed and injured as well as the Michigan State community. While these senseless acts of violence are unsettling and may cause uncertainty about campus safety, please be assured that the safety of our students, faculty, staff, and visitor's is our highest priority. The entire Public Health & Safety Department, and all our college and district leadership, are focused on ensuring our campuses are safe and well prepared.

- The District Police provides both in-person and video training on Active Shooter/Assailant response. Please see our new 4-minute "Run Hide Fight" awareness video specifically intended for our campuses here.
- Both West Valley College and Mission College have a Behavioral Intervention Team (BIT) consisting of members from Student Services, Public Health & Safety, and Human Resources. These teams evaluate behavioral issues and potential threats and make recommendations and referrals.
- All District police officers are trained in active shooter response, and they also train with other police/sheriff departments, fire, and paramedics.
- The District Police works closely with the Northern California Regional Intelligence Center and other law enforcement agencies to share information and evaluate potential threats.

We rely on all the members of our community to be aware of and report unusual or suspicious behavior. If you experience a situation that doesn't seem right, please report it.
